

READING from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Colossians

BRETHREN, we thank God the Father who has enabled us to share in the saints in light. He has delivered us from the power of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son in whom we have deliverance, the remission of sins.

He is the image of the invisible God, the first-born of all creation; for in Him all things were created, those in heaven and those on earth, the seen and the unseen, whether Thrones or Dominations or Principalities or Powers: all things were created through Him all things hold together; and He is the head of the body, the Church. He is the beginning, the first-born from the dead, so that He may be first in all things.

When Jesus saw her, he called her to him and said to her, "Woman, thou art delivered from thy infirmity." And he laid his hands upon her, and instantly she was made straight, and glorified God. But the ruler of the synagogue, indignant that Jesus had cured on the Sabbath, addressed the crowd, saying, "There are six days in which one ought to work; on these therefore come and be cured, and not on the Sabbath." But the Lord answered him and said, "Hypocrites! Does not each one of you on the Sabbath loose his ox or ass from the manger, and lead it forth to water? And this woman, daughter of Abraham as she is, whom Satan has bound, lo, for eighteen years, ought not she to be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath?" And as he said these things, all his adversaries were put to shame; and the entire crowd rejoiced at all the glorious things that were done by him.

The **CHRISTMAS FAST** for the Melkite Church begins today, **Sunday, December 10, 2023.** The time of this Fast previously began on November 15th). Our Diocesan policy at present recommends that we fast from all food and drink from midnight until Noon each day and abstain from meat and meat products on Wednesdays and Fridays and on Christmas Eve. Let the Holy Spirit lead you in personal preparation for this Holy Season. Please make this **Christmas first and foremost a Spiritual Feast.** Make your peace with God in the Mystery of Confession. Receive Him in Holy Communion. Begin the New Year reconciled to God and determine to worship Him regularly. May Christmas bring a rebirth of grace to you individually, to your family and to our whole Parish Community. Together may we "grow to the full maturity of Christ". (Ephesians 4:15) during the year.

<u>A CHANGING WORLD:</u> To evangelize, we need to understand the culture which people live. Times are changing and so is the way people think and view things. What used to be called profiteering is now called inflation. What used to be called Christian discipline is now called unhealthy repression. What used to be called living in sin is now called a meaningful relationship. What used to be called perversion is now called an alternative lifestyle. We neglect the needy and call it self-preservation. This is only a taste of what is to come. We are living in a time where there is a major shift in values. The Western world is slowly becoming de-Christianized. We need not only the power of the Holy Spirit, but to have our minds formed with solid Christian teaching and moral behavior.

VOCATION VIEW: Notice in the Gospel that "religious" people did not have a correct understanding of what "religion" is all about. In the epistle, Paul is speaking to Christians, church members, not pagans, about the need to grow in true "religion", keeping the proper perspective. Our clergy has this mission to all of us today. Unfortunately, we are experiencing a lack of sufficient priests in the Eparchy. Please encourage men in your parish to consider this vocation.

STARLIGHT: 'Try not to rush towards Christmas. Open the gift that God offers in this season of Advent. Dim the lights of the world and open your eyes and your heart to the starry night. Let the Word of God whisper its truth to your heart.

TODAY, there will be a special collection taken up for your **FUEL OFFERINGS**. Help defray the cost of heating the church and rectory, as prices are escalating rapidly. We must remember that utilities are more than doubled in our new complex. Your generosity would be greatly appreciated.

<u>REFLECTION:</u> To "let go" is to admit powerlessness, which means the outcome is not in your hands.







Bent and Twisted




There are few things in life more difficult to bear than a prolonged illness or permanent condition. In the Gospel today, we meet a woman who probably expected a lifetime of physical pain and struggle. She had been contorted not just for a week or a month or a year, but for a full eighteen years. There was no reason to believe her situation would change. She was bent over at the waist – contorted, the Fathers say, by an evil spirit. She had a most abnormal crease in the middle of her body. She couldn't straighten up. The Lover of mankind looked with concern and sympathy on this miserable human creature, and saw in her not a withered and twisted animal, but a daughter of Abraham, a soul created by God and deserving of His mercy.

Bent and twisted as this lady was, we should notice that her priorities were a lot straighter than those of many who walk upright. Saint Luke tells us that her miraculous healing occurred in one of the Synagogues on the Sabbath. We may ask ourselves, "What was this lady doing in the synagogue?" Well, obviously, she was there to worship. But you know what? It couldn't have been easy for her to be there. If she had been looking for an excuse not to be there, she had a pretty good one! You can imagine her saying, "Rabbi, I just prefer to stay home. It's hard for me to walk to synagogue, my back hurts terribly by the time I get there. When I'm there, people stare at me and I feel so uncomfortable. It's just better for me to stay home!"

The truth is that she was there because it was a priority for her to be there. Her body may have been bent, but her priorities were straight. God came first. She did not let the obstacles of life get in the way; she didn't let it stop her. She was there and that is the point. She made herself available so that God in His time and through His means could heal her. All she did was to show up and be present.

The example of the woman healed today is a good lesson for all of us. If we take our life in Christ seriously, and believe that the church through her sacraments offers us grace and healing, as long as we are physically able, it is important for us to be present in the life of the church. If we are honest: most people usually figure out a way to do the things they really want to do. This crippled women struggled to put God first. She, in her own feeble way, was saying yes to the Master.




It should be stressed that in today's gospel the women's healing was the result of her presence in the synagogue that day, not the cause of it. There is no indication in the text that she came looking for healing. She just came to the assembly where God's people were gathered, as was probably her custom. Jesus saw her and called out to her. She didn't see Him and call to Him; she was not even near Him. So we can see that because she was there, she was available. She was available to receiving the healing grace that Jesus offered that day. Had she just stayed home that Saturday, her back would have remained just as bent as it was on Friday.

Here's the point for us: A most basic condition for the grace of the Holy Spirit to be present in our lives is that we be avail-able to God. Sounds simple... So how do we practically make ourselves available? We try, with God's help, to continually say Yes to God in all that we do throughout our day and we practice patience in our infirmities, no matter what they are. We also have many gifts of grace available to us. In addition to the rich services of the church and the holy sacraments, a consistency in a rule of prayer, accountability and an ongoing relationship with a Priest. Sometimes we forget that what attracts the grace of God is just being quiet and still, saying the Jesus prayer. Also visiting monasteries, and making pilgrimages to holy sites, and the observances of fasts and feasts are aids for us in reminding us of what is important on this earth. All these, and much more, have the purpose of rendering us available to God.

We all should realize that the bent over woman in the Gospel had no special claim to the mercy and grace of God. God simply was a priority in her life; so much so, that she was willing to endure pain, suffering, and discomfort to be faithful to him, and wait on Him with patience. But in that process of putting God first, she found the solution to the thing she struggled most with. When the mercy and salvation of God entered that synagogue on that day, she was there. She didn't have to plead for anything from God; but she was available. And so the abundance of God's goodness was poured out on her. Let us be reminded of Jesus' words: "...seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added to you."

Let us take those words to heart. Seek first the kingdom of God; be present; make yourself available; and may His great mercy and grace be poured out on you now and ever, and unto ages of ages.

هناك شخص سر ابتعاده عن الله وضعفه الروحي والنفسي والجسدي، انه مربوط من عدو الخير. لو القيد من سلاسل حديد او نحاس يمكن ان تقطع، لكن لو كان القيد روحى، لا يوجد سوى شخص احد قادر ان يحطم هذه الربط والقيود. لذلك قال لنا السيد المسيح في نفس الاصحاح بعد ان اطلق المرأة التي اراد اليهود رجمها لانها سقطت في الزنا. "تعرفون الحق والحق يحرركم". "ان حرركم الابن فبالحقيقة تكونون احرارا"(يو8)

هناك 4 امور يقدر ان يعملها يسوع:

رآها – دعاها – شفاها – حماها

- •رآها: اريد ان اقول ان المسيح يعرف ما انت فيه. لا يوجد سبب يجعلك تخفي بؤسك. ان المسيح يعرف كل ضعفك. اسف في التعبير "انت متعب وتتعب من حولك".
- •دعاها: الرب يقول لكل منا "دعوتك باسمك. انت لي". كان هناك اناس كثيرون، لكن المسيح لم يدعو الا زكا وقال "ينبغي ان امكث اليوم في بيتك".

•شفاها: فوضع عليها يده ففي الحال استقامت" "في الحال" ليس شفاء تدريجي. "

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



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
