

Canon Law prohibits accepting stipends or offerings for Liturgies more than one year in advance (rolling calendar) Canon 953. The time within which Liturgies must be celebrated (1 year) begins the day the intention is received. (Canon 955 #2). Formerly under the jurisdiction of the local Latin Ordinaries before the Exarchate was established under the leadership of the late Bishiop Justin Najmy of this Parish, all Melkites have been subject to the latter since its erection in 1966. The Constitution of the Melkite Eparchy which is now a sole Diocese since 1976 still acknowledges this definitive protocol. Our parishes follow local discipline in the various customs e.g. every day clergy attire, stipends (Liturgy Offerings), etc. except in Liturgy and Ritual. Our relationship with the local Latin Dioceses and Latin pastors must be permeated with a spirit of love and friendship and cooperation.

All Liturgy offerings received from Funerals, which exceed more than one year, have had the maximum and minimum celebrations. Surplus ones have been deposited in the Building Fund and placed on the altar and remembered similarly to the customs of spiritual bouquets, perpetual Mass enrollments, & memorial cards, as in chapels, shrines, & monasteries. May the memories of our beloved deceased rest in peace & be eternal. Many thanks for your understanding and undivided attention in regard to these guidelines and restrictions.

Presently effective, the schedule of offerings in parishes is now: Liturgies: \$25.00; Funerals: \$300.00; Weddings:\$300.00; Baptisms: \$100.00.

في انجيل اليوم يسوع يلتقي بالعشرة رجال برص خارج القرية . فانه بحسب الشريعة الموسوية لا يسكن الابرص في داخل القرية او المدينة انما خارجها في البرية او في القبور . ويكون ممزقا الثياب وينادي نجس نجس . هذه حالة تكشف عن بشاعة نجاسة الخطية التي كانت ترمز اليها بمرض البرص في العهد القديم .

قد وقف اولئك البرص بعيدا ولم يقدروا ان يقتربوا من يسوع لانهم كانوا يعتقدون بانه لا يمكن لاحد ان ينظر اليهم دون نفور . ولذلك قد رفعوا اصواتهم بكل عواطف الايمان والمحبة وقائلين يا يسوع يا معلم ارحمنا .

وكانوا يرجون استجابة طلبتهم وشفائهم من امراضهم بحسب ما يشاء يسوع ويرتضي ان يمنحهم وينعم عليهم بشفاء .

كبرص حرموا من السكن وسط الناس وربما لم يشهدوا باعينهم المعجزات التي صنعها الرب يسوع انما سمعوا عنها ، لكنهم بالايمان منه اقتربوا اليه ونالوا الشفاء والتطهير ، بينما راى الكثير من الفريسيين والصدوقيين السيد المسيح وشاهدوا اعماله الفائقة وبعدم الايمان حرموا انفسهم من صداقته .

ايضا لاحظنا بان السيد المسيح امرهم بان يذهبوا الى الكهنة ليروا انفسهم لهم ليؤكد انه ما جاء لينقض الشريعة بل يكملها وايضاكي يعطي للكهنة اليهود دليلا ماديا على قدرته على الشفاء والتطهير.

الامر الذي عجز عنه الناموس العهد القديم ، لعلهم يؤمنون ان نعمة الرب يسوع تفوق الناموس . وفي هذا التصرف ايضا يوجهنا الرب يسوع للخضوع للكنيسة وتعاليمها وايضا يلزم الخاطئ بالذهاب الى منبر الاعتراف الى الكاهن لكي يعترف بخطاياه وينال الحل .

هذا الالزام وهذه الضرورة كان يسوع قادرا ان يشفهيم ولا يلزمهم آمرا اياهم ان يعترفوا بخطاياهم جميعا مهما كانت شنيعة .

الاعتراف بالنسبة الى حالة النفس الخاطئة هو اقوى واسطة هيأها يسوع لمحو الخطايا . لذلك قال الكتاب المقدس : " ادخلوا ابوابه (ابواب الله) بالاعتراف " . فقد اظهر واوضح النبي داود من صلاته نعمة الله ورحمته في تنقية خطاياه اذ قال : " ارحمني يالله بحسب رحمتك وبحسب كثرة رافتك امح مآثمي طهرني من خطيئتي فاني عارف بآثمي وخطئتي في كل حين " .

لنعد يا احباء الى رجال البرص العشرة ، فقد امنوا بكلمة يسوع وبينما هم منطلقون طهروا فواحد منهم لما رأى انه شفي رجع وكان سامريا واصبح ساجدا مصليا وشكورا ، رجع يمجد الله بصوت عظيم مقدما العبادة والشكر للرب يسوع المخلص اذ انبطح على وجهه عند قدمي المسيح شاكرا له .

A lifestyle of thanksgiving



1. Be thankful even if you are in difficult circumstances.

This kind of thankfulness is faith. We read the story too quickly, I think. Slow it down, and picture it with me. We start with ten men who have the worst disease of their day. The physical ramifications are horrendous. Leprosy attacks the body, leaving sores, missing fingers, missing toes, damaged limbs. In many cases, the initial pain of leprosy gives way to something more terrible than that - a loss of sensation in nerve endings, leading to more damage to more body parts. The disease can take 30 years to run its course, and in that time span, entire limbs can simply fall off. It is, assuredly, a most horrible disease. We have nearly an impossible task in trying to fathom what it was like 2,000 years ago, when medical treatment as we know it today was almost non existent.

And, I think, we gained a new appreciation of how bad this disease must have been in the days of Christ. It wasn't just the grotesque damage, or the attack to our sight. It wasn't just the loud cries, the attack to our hearing. It was also the smell of rotting, decaying flesh, overwhelming even our sense of smell.

The emotional pain of a leper, however, must have been even worse than the physical pain. He was removed from his family, from his community. There could be no contact, whatsoever, with his children or grandchildren. None. Immediately removed. His wife would not be allowed to kiss him goodbye. He would not have allowed it, for fear that she, too, would become afflicted.

Lepers tended to roam together, looking for food, begging for assistance from a great distance, learning to yell in loud voices, both from the need to warn others, and to beg for help from across the way.

What would it have been like to have been removed from friends and family for a lifetime, and to have been forced to announce that removal on a daily basis? It must have been horrible.

God who loves you so much, will give you the opportunity to be thankful when nothing about your circumstances gives you that motivation. My friends, that is the very definition of faith. If you praised God only on the good days, only in the best of circumstances, it would not be faith at all. That would be more like a business arrangement - and this is not about business!

Some of you are in horrible circumstances, right now. And what awaits you today, this week, is a forcing of the question. Will you be thankful despite the difficult circumstances? If so, you will have experienced faith.

2. Be thankful in the work of God's goodness

This kind of thankfulness is worship. One of the men came back to Jesus, and praised God. He was thankful. He was public about it. He was loud - he wasn't shy at all.

Why was he so loud? This guy had been forced to yell for as long as he'd had leprosy. Had it been years? He'd probably yelled so long, he didn't know how to come to the Lord quietly, or even in a normal voice. When he came back and fell at the feet of Jesus, he was just louder than the normal person, and he was praising God.

This week, be sure you take time to acknowledge God for his goodness. Be sure to actually be thankful. Be sure to gather everyone up for a prayer of Thanksgiving that's a real prayer of thankfulness. Don't miss the opportunity to worship God this week. And be loud about it!

3. Make sure your thankfulness leads to action

One healed leper came back. One caught himself in the midst of the celebration, and returned to Jesus. He reversed his steps, put his family on hold, put the priest on hold, and came back to the cause of his celebration. His response and life situation were unique, but in the simplest sense of what he did his thankfulness led to action. And boy, did that turn out to be important!

"Where are the other nine?" Jesus asked. Do you realize what this says? Jesus said, "Go, and show yourselves to the priests. Jesus never commanded that any of them express thankfulness to God, or return to him, the healer. Nevertheless, that is what Jesus expected.

Shouldn't our spirit of thankfulness last longer than that? Get it done!

4. A lifestyle of thankfulness is a lifestyle of wellness

"... If you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. (so-dzo). For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved (so-dzo!) (Romans 10:9-10).

And Jesus says to this very thankful man willing to follow God before his circumstances changed - to worship God before he returned home - Jesus pronounces a complete healing, a wellness that passes all other wellness terms. This man, Jesus said, understands. Do you understand?

Can I give you another reason to love this Jesus? Can I show you another proof that he loves you, no matter who you are, where you've been, or what you've done?

LITURGY OR MASS INTENTIONS



Divine Liturgy intentions can be scheduled for those who have died, and on the occasion of a birthday, wedding anniversary, for healing for the conversion of sinners, for the grace to face the challenges in life, for the success in a new job, for those serving in the church and country in different levels, for good weather, bountiful harvest, for world peace, in thanksgiving for the blessings received, etc. You can find so many reasons to think about a Mass offering. We offer the Mass for a specific intention because we believe in the immense spiritual value of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

The custom of giving offering to have Liturgies said for specific intentions is a laudable one and should be maintained as much as possible. Church teaching and Canon Law (nos. 942-958) provide important guidelines on how to preserve the dignity and appreciation of this practice. Overall, it should be well noted that Liturgy offerings are never to be viewed as a means of parish fundraising.

<u>COMMEMORATIONS OF THE DEAD</u>: The Apostolic Constitutions refer to the repetition of the Mass on the third, ninth and fortieth days: "Let the third day be observed in remembrance of the dead with psalms, lessons, and prayers, because Christ rose from the dead on the third day. Let the ninth day be observed in remembrance both of the living and the dead, and also the fortieth day, in accordance with mourning customs of the Israelites at the time of Moses' death. Finally, let the anniversary day be observed in memory of the dead."

In contemporary Byzantine practice, the dead are commemorated on the ninth and fortieth days and on the anniversary of their departure from this world.

Formerly under the jurisdiction of the local Latin Ordinaries before the Exarchate was established under the leadership of the late Bishop Justin Najmy of this Parish, all Melkites have been subject to the latter since its erection in 1966. The Constitution of the Melkite Eparchy which is now a sole Diocese since1976 still acknowledges this definitive protocol. Our parishes follow local discipline in the various customs e.g., clergy attire, stipends (Mass Offerings), etc. except in Liturgy and Ritual. Our relationship with the local Latin Dioceses and Latin pastors must be permeated with a spirit of love and friendship and cooperation.

Effective January 1, 2008, which by-passed us, the schedule of offerings for Masses in parishes is now \$25.00; Funerals: \$300.00; Weddings: \$300.00.

Canon Law prohibits accepting stipends or offerings for Masses more than one year in advance (rolling calendar) Canon 953. The time within which Masses must be celebrated (1 year) begins the day the intention is received (Canon 955 #2.)

May the memories of our beloved deceased be eternal and many thanks for your understanding and undivided attention in regard to these guidelines and restrictions.

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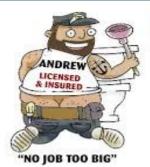
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
