





طريق الخلاص



يروي الإنجيل (را. يو 9، 1-14) حادثة الرجل الأعمى منذ ولادته، والذي أعاد إليه يسـوع الـبصر. هـذه المعجزة هي علامة تؤكد ما قاله يسـوع عن نفسه: "أنا نور العالم" (الآبة 5)، النور الذي ينيـر ظـلـمـاتـنـا. يعمل يسوع على مستويين: على مستوى الجسـد والروح. إنه يمنح الأعمى أولًا أن يرى بعيني الجسـد، ثم يقوده إلى الإيمان "بابن الإنسـان" (الآية 35)، أي بيسوع. والآيات التي يصنعها ليست معجزات لإذهـال الناس، بل تهدف إلى توصيلهم إلى الإيمان من خلال مسيرة تحوَّل وتوبة في داخل النفس.

أُصرَّ الفريسيون وعلماء الشريعة على رفض الاعتراف بالمعجزة، وطرحوا أسئلة ماكرة على الرجـل الـذي شُفِي. واجههم الأعمى بقوّة الواقع: "أعرف أمرًا واحدًا: كنت أعمى والآن أنا أبصر" (آية 25). بـيـن عـدم الثقّة والعداء في قلوب الذين يحيطون به ويسألونه وهم غير مؤمنين، بدأ الرجل الأعمى مسيرة حـمـلـتـه تدريجًا إلى اكتشاف هوية الشخص الذي فتح عينيه، وإلى الاعتراف والإيمان به. في البداية اعتبره نـبـيّ (الآية 17)، ثم اعترف به أنه رجل من عند الله (را. آية 33)؛ وأخيرًا قبله على أنه المسيح وسجـد لـه (را. الآيات 36- 38). وفهم أن يسوع، إذ منحه البصر، "أظهر فيه أعمال الله" (را. الآية 25).

ليتنا نقوم نحن أيضًا بهذه الخبرة! بنور الإيمان، اكتشف الأعمى هويته الجديدة. إنه الآن "خليقة جـديـدة"، قادر على رؤية حياته والعالم من حوله في ضوء جديد، لأنه دخل في شركة مع المسيح. لم يعد متسـولًا مهمشًا من قبل المجتمع؛ لم يعد عبدًا للعمى وللأفكار المسبقة. مسيرة النور التي بـدأهـا هـي صورة ومجاز لمسيرة التحرر من الخطيئة التي نحن مدعوون إليها. تشبه الخطيئة حجابًا مُعْتِمًا يغطـي وجـهـنا ويمنعنا من رؤية أنفسنا والعالم بوضوح. المغفرة التي يمنحنا إياه الله تزيل ستار الظل والظلام وتـمـنحـنا نورًا جديدًا. ليكن الصوم الذي نعيشه الزمن المناسب والثمين للاقتراب من الرّب يسوع، طالبين رحـمـته، من خلال طرق مختلفة تقترحها علينا الكنيسة الأم.

الرجل الأعمى الذي شُغِي، والذي يرى الآن بعيني الجسد والروح، هو صورة لكل شخص معمد، غـمـرته النعمة، فبددت الظلمات فيه، ووضعته في نور الإيمان. لكن لا يكفي قبول النور. يجب أن نصـير نـورًا. كـل واحد منا مدعو لقبول النور الإلهي ولإظهاره في حياتنا كلها. قال المسيحيون الأوائل، ولاهوتيون الـقـرون الأولى، أن جماعة المسيحيين، أي الكنيسة، هي "سر القمر"، لأنها تعطي النور، الذي ليس نورهـا، بـل النور الذي تستقبله من المسيح. نحن أيضًا يجب أن نكون "سر القمر": لإعطاء النور الذي نـمـير نـورًا. كـل الشمس، أي المسيح، الرب. يذكرنا بذلك القديس بولس اليوم بقوله: "سيروا سيرة أبناء النور. فإن ثـمـر النور يكون في كل صلاح وبر وحق" (أف 5، 8- 9). إن بذار الحياة الجديدة التي وُضعت فينا في المعمودية هي مثل شرارة النار، التي تُطهرنا أولًا، وتحرق الشر الذي في قلوبنا، ثم تسمح لنا بـأن نشـع ونضـيء لغيرنا.

لتساعدنا مريم العذراء الكليّة القداسة لنقتدي بالرجل الأعمى الذي ذكره الإنجيل، احتاى ايغامارنا اناور المسيح ونسير معه على طريق الخلاص.

The miracle of sight

If we are sincere about asking God to "open our eves," to see as God sees, then we must also be willing to change the way we live our lives so that our lives reflect God's point to view, and not ours.

Here's



which camp we are in. We are His friends, and need to become more so. And the way to that deeper friendship is to consider how God acts in our lives, as He did in the life of the blind man.

This mud, this healing, tells us a

example of how life changes once you're given a new perspective. How many of you wear glasses or contact lenses? Then you might know what I am talking about. When I was in the 6th grade, I got my first pair of glasses. When I stepped out of the doctor's office into the parking lot, the first thing I saw was this tree. Now, I had never in my life seen a tree like that. Before I got the glasses, I thought trees were just blobs of green and brown and red and orange. Theoretically, I knew what a tree looked like. I could see leaves and bark and such. But after I saw them through my new glasses, I realized that a tree was more than just leaves and bark. The leaves had lines, and edges, and curves. There were birds in the trees that I could see. There were cracks and grooves in the bark that I had missed before.

Finally being able to see the detail, the intricacies of nature, and its true beauty is like how God sees each of us. In the first reading, God told Samuel that God doesn't see as humans see. We can only see part of the picture, what's on the outside of a person. But God sees deeper, into the heart of that person. God sees the fullness of that person's potential. God sees that person's intricate and detailed beauty.

How differently we would act if each time we encountered our co-workers or neighbors or people on the street, we saw Christ. How differently we would treat our parents, our children, our spouse, and our classmates, our friends, our enemies. How differently we would treat the people who sit around us in church, the people we see here every week but to whom we never talk, the people who don't speak our language, the people who don't look, act, or think the way we do. How differently we would treat the beggar, the homeless, the people we label as failure, as sinner, the people we label as conservative, liberal, gay, straight, too old, too young, too dark, too light, too smart, too dumb, too much of something that doesn't fit our point of view. Imagine if each time we encounter each other, each time we speak with one another, we "see" Christ, we "hear" Jesus. How different our world would be.

Our Lord chooses to heal through the medium of mud. Ordinary mud, the stuff that we scrape off of our shoes, the stuff that we try to step over. Jesus took common dirt, mixed it with His own saliva and smeared it upon the blind man's eyes. It all sounds very mysterious, and so it must have appeared to bystanders.

Then the impossible happens, and people don't know what to think. Those who were Jesus' enemies were prepared to condemn Him, the healed man, everything about the healing. It wasn't the right time, right place, or right person. Our Lord's friends were prepared to give thanks to God and to rejoice. We do not need to ask ourselves about

lot about how God acts through the most ordinary and common things of life—even through things that we try our best to stay away from. Those are oftentimes God's chosen instruments. This includes people, unpleasant situations, and so many other things over which we have no control. For us, too, it is not always the "right" time, place, or even the "right" person who might mediate God's grace to us.

We have to remember that our lives are all about friendship with a God who became an ordinary man and lived most of his life in a most ordinary village, applying himself to the most humble occupations. He worked long hours and was paid for His labor. If we are always on the lookout for the extraordinary in religion we will only find what our imagination produces.

Sometimes people drive themselves crazy imagining all sorts of extraordinary things about themselves and others which simply have no basis in reality. Strong mental images and strong feelings do not change reality, and they do not prepare us to receive God's intervention in our lives in the thousand and one humble ways that He chooses to make use of. This is why the advice of true mystics. The arena of Christian struggle and perfection, the venue of our spiritual growth, is the same earth upon which our Savior worked, prayed, preached, and suffered. As He enlightens us to see this, then our outlook becomes truly Christian, and we begin to look out for the divine in daily life. This blind man who found healing at the hands of Christ was not looking for it; that would have been most extraordinary and unusual. He was simply begging because he was, simply, blind. He was doing his best under the circumstances. And the Lord knew that and everything else about him and so chose him to receive this miracle that would lead to his confession of faith: "I do believe, Lord."

And in the midst of the bustling Temple area, where people were going about their ordinary business, he fell down and worshipped his God. Jesus also wills to fill our eyes with this light, so that they open to this startling discovery of faith: In the Lord's hands, the ordinary "clay" of daily life becomes a reason to believe.

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


