Gospel 3rd Sunday after Pentecost,

Matthew 6:22-33

The Lord said: The lamp of the body is the eye. If your eye is sound, your whole body will be full of light. But if your eye is evil, your whole body will be full of darkness. Therefore, if the light that is in you is darkness, how great is the darkness itself! No man can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will stand by the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. Therefore, I say to you, do not be anxious for your life, what you shall eat and drink; nor yet for your body, what you shall wear. Is not life a greater thing than food, and the body than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow, or reap, or gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are not you of much more value than they? But which of you by being anxious about it can add to his stature a single cubit? And as for clothing, why are you anxious? See how the lilies of the field grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I say to you that not even Solomon in all his glory was adorned like one of these. But if God so clothes the wild flower of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, how much more you, O you of little faith! Therefore, do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or, 'What shall we drink?', or, 'What are we to wear?' (For all these things the Gentiles seek); for your heavenly Father knows you need all these things. But seek first the kingdom of God and His justice, and all the rest shall be given you besides."

Just email him at <u>office@stbasilthegreatchurch.com</u> and leave him your message. **PLEASE! NO GRATUITIES!** A cup of coffee or tea is just fine. He looks forward to in-person contact.

Canon Law prohibits accepting stipends or offerings for Liturgies more than one year in advance (rolling calendar) Canon 953. The time within which Liturgies must be celebrated (1 year) begins the day the intention is received. (Canon 955 #2). Formerly under the jurisdiction of the local Latin Ordinaries before the Exarchate was established under the leadership of the late Bishiop Justin Najmy of this Parish, all Melkites have been subject to the latter since its erection in 1966. The Constitution of the Melkite Eparchy which is now a sole Diocese since 1976 still acknowledges this definitive protocol. Our parishes follow local discipline in the various customs e.g every day clergy attire, stipends (Liturgy Offerings), etc. except in Liturgy and Ritual. Our relationship with the local Latin Dioceses and Latin pastors must be permeated with a spirit of love and friendship and cooperation.

PLEASE NOTE: Presently effective, the schedule of offerings in the parishes is now: Liturgies: \$25.00; Funerals: \$300.00; Weddings: \$300.00; Baptisms: \$100.00.

Thus far, all Liturgy Offerings received from Funerals, which exceeded more than one year or even more, have had the maximum and minimum celebrations. Surplus ones have been deposited in the Building Fund, and placed on the altar and remembered collectively, similar to the customs of Spiritual Bouquets, Perpetual Mass Enrollments & Memorial Cards, as in Chapels, Shrines, & Monasteries.

May the memories of our beloved deceased rest in peace & be eternal. Many thanks for your understanding and undivided attention in regard to these canonical guidelines and restrictions.

(يوحنا٤:٤٤). «الَّذِي أَرْسَلَنِي وَأُتَمِّمَ عَمَلَهُ ثالثاً: يقدَّم الرب يسوع علاجًا لمرض الهم الطيور والزهور: انظروا إلى طيور السماء،

وتأملوا زنابق الحقل كيف تنمو.

الطيور: هي الأقل في المملكة الحيوانية، لا تزرع ولا تحصد والآب خَمْسنَةُ عَصنافِيرَ تُبَاعُ »السماوي يعطيها الطعام. كما أن ثمنها بخس ، وحتى المكروه كالغربان أبوكم يهتم به (لوقا ٢٤:٦، ٢٤). «بِفَلْسَيْنِ

وَلاَ سُلَيْمَانُ فِي كُلِّ »الزهور: هي الأقل في المملكة النباتية، ورغم بساطتها فَإِنْ كَانَ »ثم يستطرد الرب مطمئنًا بالقول . «رَمَجْدِهِ كَانَ يَلْبَسُ كَوَاحِدَة مِنْهَا عُشْبُ الْحَقْلِ الَّذِي يُوجَدُ الْيَوْمَ وَيُطْرَحُ غَداً فِي التَّقُورِ يُلْبِسُهُ اللَّهُ هَكَذَا، أَفَلَيْسَ (متى ٢٩-٣٠). «إِلْحَرِيّ جِداً يُلْبِسُكُمْ أَنْتُمْ يَا قَلِيلِي الإِيمَانِ؟

أبوكم السماوي: يلفت الرب يسوع الأنظار إلى الآب السماوي السخي في لأنَّ »، و أيضاً «وَ أَبُوكُمُ السَّمَاوِيُّ يَقُونُهَا » العطاء، فيطمئن قلوبنا بالقول: (متى ٢٦: ٢٦). «أَبَاكُمُ السَّمَاوِيُّ يَغْلَمُ أَنَّكُمْ تَحْتَاجُونَ إِلَى هَذِهِ كُلِّهَا

اطلبوا أولًا ملكوت الله وبره: يختتم الرب حديثه المطمئن بحث مؤمنيه بطلب ملكوت الله. وهذا يعني طلب سيادة الله وكلامه، وطلب بره يعني تجاوبنا نحن مع كلامه والعيشة به. عش للرب واطلب واهتم أن يكون هو السيد. ولم يقُل الرب يسوع ثم اهتم بعد ذلك بأمورك، لا بل النتيجة أن الآب السماوي نفسه سيهتم بأمورك. لقد ذهب دانيال إلى عُليته لا ليطلب انقاذه من الأسود، بل صلى وحمد كما كان يفعل، والرب أرسل ملاكه وسد أفواه

عزيزي أرجو ملاحظة أن هذه ليست دعوة التواكل بل للاتكال على الآب السماوي. والرب يسوع نفسه الذي علَّم بالاتكال على الآب، هو الذي أمر بطرس أن يذهب للبحر ويصطاد لكي يسدد ما عليه. إن المؤمنين الحقيقيين يتمتعوا بهذا الإيمان وهذه الفضيلة، أي الثقة في إلههم والطمان الكامل أنه يعتنى بهم.

﴿لَمْ أَرَ صِدِّيقاً تُخُلِّيَ عَنْهُ وَلاَ ذُرِّيَّةً لَهُ تَلْتَمِسُ خُبْزاً» يقول المختبر (مزمور ٢٥:٣٧). فهل يا ترى تمتعت بهذا الإيمان الواثق والاتكال الكامل على أبيك السماوي؟

إنه يعلم احتياجنا قبل أن نسأل، بل ويملأ كل احتياجنا بحسب غناه في المجد في المسيح يسوع.

في عظة الجبل، يتحدث الرب يسوع لسامعيه ولنا عن سلوكيات رعايا ملكوته. واحدة من النصائح الهامة لهم، هي توجيه أنظار هم إلى روعة الثقة والاتكال على الآب السماوي.

تعالوا لنستمتع بحديث السيد الجميل والمطمئن في عظة الجبل.

أولاً: ضرورة الابتعاد عن مرض العصر وهو الهم

لاَ تَهْنَمُوا » ثلاث مرات في حديث الرب لسامعيه يحذر هم من الهم؛ قائلاً: ومرة ثانية . «لِحَيَاتِكُمْ بِمَا تَأْكُلُونَ وَبِمَا تَشْرَبُونَ وَلاَ لاَجْسَادِكُمْ بِمَا تَأْبَسُونَ وَاخْدِراً «فَلاَ تَهْتَمُوا قَائِلِينَ: مَاذَا نَأْكُلُ أَوْ مَاذَا نَشْرَبُ أَوْ مَاذَا نَلْبَسُ؟ » يقول (متى 7: «فَلاَ تَهْتَمُوا لِلْغَو لأَنَّ الْغَدَ يَهْتَمُ بِمَا لِنَفْسِهِ. يَكُفِي النَوْمَ شَرَّه » يقول: (٣٤٠٣١،٢٥). لا نهتم سواء بيومنا ولا بغدنا.

ثانياً: لماذا يجب ألا نهتم؟

The Birds of the Air and the Lilies of the Field

1. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? We tend to spend a lot of our time worried about our physical life, sustenance, and accessories. Think about it: Do you spend more time worried about your soul—about your obedience to God, rest in the Lord, etc.—or about your bank account, house, health, food, etc.?

That preaches something. That preaches something about what we think is the most important, most valuable thing. Our anxiety about these things shows us that we believe them to be at the center. Our

actual theology is betrayed by our actual worries.

So the first point Jesus makes is that anxiety about daily bread and raiment reveals what we believe to actually live at the center of life.

2. Are you not of more value than they?\Birds seem to have figured this out. They just go about being and doing what they were made to be and to do, and the Father feeds them. The point isn't that we are to be and do what birds do, but to be and do what people were made to be and to do.

So people were made to cultivate and farm and grow and adorn and store up and build things. That's not the point. The point is that if we simply point our lives at what it is that God has made us for—living for his glory and approval, obeying his Word, loving our neighbor, and more—then we ought to be able to trust that our Father will feed us, like he does the birds.

3. And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life?

Can you worry yourself into longer life? Can you worry another five minutes onto your span? No. And not just because that doesn't work on a utilitarian sort of level. But no, because the span of your life is already marked out. Did you know that? So even when we worry about real things—like, for example, maybe you are actually hungry and broke. Or maybe you are actually ill and facing death—we are not actually changing the moment of our departure from this mortal coil. God is exhaustively sovereign. You will die when he has determined that you will die.

What a gift, right? What freedom that doctrine ought to give us! That means that, even as I do what I should to seek health so I can use my strength to serve God and his people, even if I get cancer, I need not shoulder the responsibility for trying to re-number my own days.

God is working the pre-determined span of your life—conception to



burial—together for your good and the good of his good plan.

4. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? if the Father clothes grass as it does what it was made to do, he will clothe us as we do what we were made to do. Trust your Father.

The Ultimate Antidote to Worry

The antidote to worry is not to do nothing to secure your needs. It is rather

to seek first the things that are first—the Kingdom of God and the righteousness of God—and then to use those lesser things to serve that greater thing.

Do you see how this serves as the antidote to all of our sin? All of our sin is, at bottom, a matter of improperly ordered loves. It is a matter of seeking first that which is not first—and therefore turning even glories into horrors.

Seek first after sexual pleasure, and the glory that is sexual pleasure will become a horror, a slaver, a ruinous thing. It will consume realms and peoples and nations. It will lead to the most gruesome of evils.

Seek first after wealth, and the glory that is wealth will become a horror, a slaver, and a ruinous thing.

Seek first after comfort, and the glory that is comfort will become a horror, a slaver, and a ruinous thing.

Seek first after family, and the glory that is family will become a horror, a slaver, and a ruinous thing.

Seek first after achievement, and the glory that is achievement will become a horror, a slaver, and a ruinous thing.

Seek first after wealth, and the glory that is wealth will become a horror, a slaver, and a ruinous thing.

Seek first after knowledge, and the glory that is knowledge will become a horror, a slaver, and a ruinous thing.

Seek first after beauty, marriage, strength, masculinity, femininity, renown, legacy, philosophy, power, prophetic cultural insight, and all of those lowercase glories will become horrors, slavers, and ruinous things.

That's why I consider this sentence, verse 33, to be possibly the most important in the sermon—it teaches us how to do everything.

Don't try to worry your way into a better tomorrow. Don't try to be the God of the future. That job is already taken, and you are secure in the grip of the God who writes the future, rules the future, and promises good to us in the future.
