Gospel of the Divine Liturgy -

Luke 16:19-31 (5th Sunday after Holy Cross)

At that time, Jesus told this parable: 'There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table; even the dogs would come and lick his sores. The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. In Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. He called out, "Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in agony in these flames." But Abraham said, "Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony. Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can cross from there to us." He said, "Then, father, I beg you to send him to my father's house— for I have five brothers—that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment." Abraham replied, "They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them." He said, "No, father Abraham; but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent." He said to him, "If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead."

The Story of a Missed Opportunity

WOULD WE BE AFFECTED if someone rose from the dead? We would probably say "Yes," but the Lord says "No." What does He know that we don't?

Throughout the centuries, and even today, many people have what might be called mystical experiences. They see visions and dream dreams, to quote the Prophet Joel. Thus St Paul experienced the risen Christ on the road to Damascus and it changed his life. Similarly, St Peter and the other disciples encountered Christ risen from the dead and proclaimed it

throughout the world. These experiences energized their ministries and jump-started the spread of the Gospel throughout the ancient world.

Such experiences continued throughout Christian history, right up to our own day. One well-known Christian thinker in the modern world, the Russian Orthodox bishop in London, Metropolitan Anthony Bloom (1914-2003) described his encounter with the Lord in these words: "I met Christ as a Person at a moment when I needed Him in order to live, and at a moment when I was not in search of Him. I was found; I did not find Him.

"I was a teenager then ... I could not accept aimless happiness. Hardships and suffering had to be overcome; there was something beyond them. Happiness seemed to be stale if it had no further meaning ... I decided that I would give myself a year to see whether life had a meaning, and if I discovered it had none, I would not live beyond the year. I had no use for Church. I did not believe in God."

He describes what happened: "I expected nothing good from my reading, so I counted the chapters of the four Gospels to be sure that I read the shortest, not to waste time unnecessarily. And thus it was the Gospel according to St Mark which I began to read.

"I do not know how to tell you of what happened. I will put it quite simply and those of you who have gone though a similar experience will know what came to pass. While I was reading the beginning of St Mark's Gospel, before I reached the third chapter, I became aware of a Presence. I saw nothing. I heard nothing. It was no hallucination. It was a simple certainty that the Lord was standing there and that I was in the presence of Him whose life I had begun to read with such revulsion and such ill-will... This was my basic and essential meeting with the Lord. From then I knew that Christ did exist."

What was different about these people, compared to the brothers of the rich man in Christ's parable?

Why "Few Are Chosen"

The Apostles were religious people; they observed the precepts of Judaism as practiced in their day. Others were contemptuous of religion and had ridiculed it. Yet somewhere deep inside them was a search for meaning, a hidden disposition to faith, even if they were not practicing any religion at the moment. Thus when these momentous experiences took place, they received them wholeheartedly and changed their entire way of life.

People who have no interest in God or in any kind of an interior life, who are content pursuing a materialist way of life might easily shrug off a spiritual experience as some kind of delusion. They might blame it on a touch of the flu or having too much to drink.



Similarly the rich man's brothers in the parable may have paid lip service to the Scriptures, but the focus of their lives was far from the things of God. They would not even have heard a voice from the dead.

Christ's Alternative

A parable is a story with a moral, not a detailed history of an event. In this case, as in most, the moral is found at the end of the story. When the rich man in the parable asks Abraham to send Lazarus to shake up his brothers, Abraham says, "They have

Moses and the prophets: let them listen to them" (Luke 16:29). In other words, they have the Scriptures – what we call the Old Testament – as their means of discerning the mind of God for them.

This saying, of course, is directed at us — it is the moral of the story. We are meant to base our faith on the mystery of Christ as revealed in the Scriptures rather than on some fantasy that the Holy Virgin or an angel might visit us. Just as our daily life must be based on something more practical than a hope of winning the lottery, so our Christian life must have the solid foundation of the Word of God to us.

We have not only the Law and the prophets, but the Gospels and Epistles. We have the witness of Christ and the apostles, the testimony of the martyrs and the ascetics. We have the power of the holy mysteries, the words of our liturgical texts and the unspoken voice of the holy icons. These are the voice of the Lord to us – let us hear them in faith.

A Missed Opportunity

When people think about violating God's law, they think about sins of commission: doing something prohibited like stealing, harming another, or the like. We often forget that sins of omission – things that we neglect to do – are often even more damaging.

The rich man in Christ's parable is not accused of any sin of commission. He is not blamed for being rich any more than Lazarus is praised for being poor: in itself, having money is not a sin. We are not told how he made his money. He is not accused of defrauding people as Zacchaeus claimed to have done. The only thing he is accused of is not giving alms.

The poor man, Christ says, lay at the rich man's gate, hoping for scraps. It may be easy to ignore a panhandler on the street; it is not so easy to ignore him when he is at your doorstep day after day. Yet this is what the rich man did. He did not overlook abstract appeals from far -away charities; he passed by a flesh-and-blood person in need on his own doorstep, "the living creature," as St John Chrysostom describes him, "for whom God cares."

The rich man in Christ's parable may have felt that he needed every scrap he had acquired, but as St John Chrysostom affirmed, he did not know what he needed it for: "If a person enjoys luxury in moderation and distributes the rest to the stomachs of the poor, then his wealth does him good. But if he is going to give himself up to luxury and profligacy, not only does it not help him at all, but it even leads him down to the great pit. That is what happened to this rich man" (On Wealth and Poverty).

حتى يومنا هذا ، ما زال البعض يعتبر أنّ الفقير هو من سينال رضى الله ، والغني هو الذي سيلقى خارجاً . وقد يبدو للبعض أنّ الله لا يحبّ الأغنياء أو لا يريدنا أن نستمتع بمالنا وبحياتنا . و هذا منطق غريب ، لا بل غير مقبول !! لأنّ كلّ ما نمتلكه هو عطيّة الله ، والمال هو عطيّة الله ، والمال هو نلك فنحن جاحدون وناكرون لنعمة الله... ولكن ، المطلوب ونحن نستمتع بالعطيّة ، ألّا ننسى العاطي ، ولا نرذل أخانا المحتاج . يقول القدّيس برنارد : " إن لم تساعد أخاك الفقير ، فأنت تسلبه حقّه و تقتله " .

هذا النّص الّذي بين أيدينا ، وإن تعمّقنا فيه وذهبنا إلى ما بعد الحرف ، سوف نفهم تماماً قصد الله من الغني والفقر.

ألملفت بداية في هذا النّص ، هو ذكر إسم الفقير " لعازر" وعدم ذكر اسم الغني . و هذا الغني المرفّه ، المتمتّع بغناه ، كان يبخل على لعازر ، حتّى بالفضلات . المسكين لعازر ، لم يكن يطلب الكثير ، بل كان يشتهي الفضلات ، ولم يذكر لنا كاتب الإنجيل أنّه كان يتذمّر أو ما شابه وكانت الكلاب تشفق عليه أكثر من الغني فتلحس قروحه .

وما تذمّر لعازر ، ومات فنقلته الملائكة إلى أحضان ا ابراهيم موت لعازر ، هو انتقال إلى السّماء ، حيث

راحته الحقيقية . أمّا الغنيّ مات ودفن وانتهى الموضوع. موت لعازر كان ربح له ، أمّا موت الغنيّ فكان موت حقيقيّ ونهاية لحياته المرفّهة والّتي لم تكن تتّسع لأخيه المحتاج. موت لعازر كان لقاءً بالله ، أمّا موت الغني فكان انفصال عنه.

ونرى الغنيّ المسكين يتعذّب من هذا الإنفصال فيستجدي أباه ابراهيم أن يرسل له لعازر كي يبلّ طرف إصبعه في الماء ويبرّد لسانه. ولماذا لعازر بالتّحديد ؟؟ ذلك لأننا نحمل تاريخنا بين أيدينا ونحن راحلون عن هذا العالم. والدّليل جواب ابراهيم: "تذكّر يا ابني ،أنك نلت نصيبك من الخيرات في حياتك ، ونال لعازر نصيبه من البلايا. وها هو الآن يتعزّى هنا وأنت تتعذّب هناك". ألغنيّ تمتّع بالخيرات ، بعطايا الله، وحده ، دون أن يلتفت حتّى إلى لعازر ، فهو نسي العاطي. أمّا لعازر وهو مطرح عند باب لعنيّ لم يتذمّر ولم يتأفّف من حاله ، وبالنّالي انتقل إلى حيث لا عذاب ولا ألم ولا جوع ولا ظلم ولا قهر. إنّه ينعم بالرّفاهيّة الحقيقيّة ، وهي الحياة مع الله.

والمشكلة الحقيقية في الهوّة الّتي تفصل بين مكان لعازر ومكان الغنيّ. يوم كان لعازر قرب الغنيّ، لم يلمحه ولم يهتمّ له، والآن انفصال الغنيّ عن الله جعله يدرك اهمّية لعازر في حياته.

خاف الغنيّ على أهل بيته ، فتوسّل للمرّة الثانية ابر اهيم أن جَميلةً؟" (ألأمّ تريزاً). يرسل لعازر إلى بيت أبيه . يا لأهمّيتك يا لعازر !!

لو ادرك الغني أهمية لعازر لما أهمله . أهمية لعازر تكمن في احتياجه ، في بؤسه ، لأنه طريق الغني إلى السماء . تقول الأم تريزا: " سوف ندرك في السماء ما قدّمه الفقراء لنا ، لأنهم طريقنا إلى قلب الله " . هذه هي أهميّة لعازر ، كان يمكن للغنيّ أن يلتفت إليه ويشركه بنعمة الله ، ولكنّه فضّل أنانيّته .

إذاً المقياس ليس الفقر أو الغنى ، المقياس هو مدى اهتمامنا ببعضنا البعض . هناك الكثير من الفقراء الذين

يتذمّرون ويكفرون بالله ويلومونه ، كما أنّنا نرى الكثير من الأغنياء يقدّمون أنفسهم ومالهم من أجل مساعدة إخوتهم . (طوبى للفقراء بالرّوح) يقول الرّب ، وليس للفقراء بالجسد ، وفقراء الرّوح هو من يستغنون عن أنانيّتهم وينطلقون نحو الآخر ، هم من لا يساوون المال بربّ المال .

غنانا ليس مرتبطاً بالمال ، وإنما بمقدار ما نجعل من يسوع المسيح محوراً لحياتنا . وجوده في حياتنا ، كنز حقيقيّ ، نغرف منه ولا ينتهي ، كما لا يمكننا الاحتفاظ به واحتكاره ، لأنّه كنز يفيض ويفيض وإن لم نفيضه على الآخر لن نشعر بقيمته . قلوبنا مركز غنانا ، فحيث هو قلبنا هناك كنزنا . ومن اختبر وجود يسوع في حياته ، اختبر الغنى الحقيقيّ ، فنحن وكأنّنا فقراء ولكنّنا نملك كلّ شيء

ألله يحبّ الجميع ، وأرادنا أن نعيش المحبّة ، وأن نتشارك عطاياه ، والفقر موجود في هذا العالم لأننا لا نتشارك نعم الرّب . لأخي حقّ عليّ ومن واجبي أن أشركه بنعم الله . لا أساعده بدافع الشّفقة ، وإنّما أعطيه حقّه ، ولأنّني أرى يسوع فيه . " "ارى الله في كل انسان. عندما أغسل جراح إنسان ، أشعر بأنني أداوي الله نفسه. أليست تجربة جميلة؟" (ألأمّ تريزا).

فلنلتفت إلى بعضنا البعض ، ولنهتم ببعضنا البعض ، فنحن إخوة بالدم ، دم يسوع المسيح . ولتكن قلوبنا منفتحة على الكنز الحقيقي يسوع المسيح كي لا تتسع الهوّة بيننا وبينه . فكلما ابتعدنا عنه ابتعدنا عن الإخوة .

REMAIN AT HOME IF...

Remain at home and self isolate if you are feeling sick. Please use the self-assesment tools at www.alberta.ca before attending.



PHYSICAL DISTANCE

Maintain physical distancing of 2 metres (6 ft) between people who are not from the same household, at all times.



WEAR A MASK

Wear Non-Medical Mask. Sanitize your hands before and after wearing or adjusting your mask.



SANITIZE

Please sanitize your hands before entering or exiting the church. Sanitizing stations are available in the church.



CHILDREN

Children should remain with their parents or guardians at all times.



General Guidelines

- Temporary maximum capacity is 150 Parishioners!
- IF you are sick, have been identified to be in a high-risk group or are over the age of 65 PLEASE stay home!
- ❖ A Face Covering is **REQUIRED** at all times once you enter the Church.
- Parishioners must Enter from the main glass doors by the fountain and Exit from baptistry doors.
- Prior to entering all visitors will have their temperature taken. Your temperature must be BELOW 100 degrees Fahrenheit to enter.
- Hand sanitizer will be available- You are encouraged to use it when you are not able to properly wash your hands.
- Collection boxes will be at the entrance of the church, baskets will NOT be circulated during the liturgy.
- * We are suspending the use of Liturgy books and printing of bulletins.
- Please follow the signs and direction of the ushers during Communion.
- Congregating of ANY kind will not be allowed!

Family Seating Guidelines

- Upon request, we will make every effort to seat family members who live in the same home together.
- You must arrive as a family in order to sit together.
- We will NOT hold seats for late arriving family members.
- ALL seats will be assigned by the ushers
- Once seated, your seat CANNOT be moved.

Phase III Revised: Picking Up Speed

Tips for a safer Halloween

Follow these tips to celebrate Halloween safely this year and help lower the chances of catching and spreading COVID-19



Safer activities and trick-or-treating

- Stay home and do not hand out candy if you have COVID-19 symptoms or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19.
 Keep your lights off so people know not to come to your door.
- Keep your group as small as possible. Limit gatherings to no more than 15 people and stick with the same 15 people.
- Use hand sanitizer before and after choosing pumpkins or picking apples.
- Take it outside. When celebrating with others, do it outdoors.
- Remember the three Ws!
- Wear a mask that's at least two layers thick and fits snugly but comfortably over your nose, mouth, and chin without any gaps.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Or carry and use hand sanitizer that's at least 60% alcohol.
- Watch your distance by staying at least six feet apart from others.
- Trick-or-treating tips
- Leave individually wrapped goodie bags lined up at least six feet from your door for kids to grab and go. Do not hand out candy from a bowl.
- Go trick-or-treating with your children to make sure they do it safely.

Safe Halloween-themed activities

- Take part in an online pumpkin carving or costume contest.
- Display Halloween-themed decorations in your home or yard.
- Organize a neighborhood contest for outdoor Halloween-themed decorations.
- Plan a Halloween scavenger hunt for the members of your household.
- Decorate your own Halloween or fall-themed face masks.
- Prepare a Halloween-themed meal or bake Halloween treats for your household.

Safe Halloween costume masks

- A Halloween costume mask alone will not protect you and others from COVID-19.
- Wearing a costume mask over a protective face covering can be dangerous if the costume mask makes it hard to breathe.
- The safest option is to wear face paints and a Halloweenthemed protective face covering.

Wear a mask that protects you and others

Wearing a face covering in public places helps protect you and anyone near you from COVID-19. Your mask should fit snugly but comfortably over your nose, mouth, and chin without any gaps.



RECOMMENDED

- Face mask worn the right way and at least two layers thick
- * N-95 respirators are critical supplies that should be reserved for healthcare providers and other first responders



NOT RECOMMENDED

- Face shield alone
- Loose-fitting bandana
- Face mask with valve
- Face mask worn the wrong way
- Neck gaiter only one layer thick

Phase III guidance for fall activities

This guidance provides recommendations for taking part in fall-related recreational and entertainment activities as safely as possible to help reduce the spread of COVID-19. Under Phase III of Rhode Island's reopening plan, all people and entities must follow all applicable Rhode Island statutes, Executive Orders, and regulations. General business guidance may be found at reopeningri.com.

General guidance

Face coverings

- All persons must wear a face covering in compliance with <u>Rhode Island Department of Health (RIDOH)</u> regulations and active Executive Orders.
 - All individuals in public or in an establishment shall wear a face covering unless they can easily and continuously stay six feet apart from others.
- A face covering or mask should fit snugly but comfortably over the nose, mouth, and chin without any
 gaps. For additional information about face coverings, refer to the following resources:
 - Wear a mask that protects you and others
 - Frequently asked questions for wearing face masks outdoors
- Masks should not be worn by children younger than age two, anyone who has trouble breathing, or anyone who is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the mask without help.

Physical distancing

- Physical distancing means keeping space between oneself and others when outside of the home to prevent the spread of disease. It includes:
 - Staying at least six feet apart from people outside the same household, unless separated by a
 physical barrier that prevents people from having direct contact and contact with any droplets
 from another person's coughing, sneezing, or talking;
 - Not gathering in groups larger than 15 people inside or outside;
 - Staying out of crowded places; and
 - Avoiding mass gatherings.
- Anyone in public or in an establishment should stay six feet apart from others at all times, to the extent
 possible.
 - When physical distancing is not feasible, people should limit their time of exposure to others the extent possible and must wear a face covering.

Other general guidance

- Outdoor activities are preferred. Open windows or doors, when possible, to improve air flow in indoor spaces.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water, for at least 20 seconds, or use hand sanitizer that is at least 60% alcohol.
- Keep a list of people you come in close contact with each day. A close contact is someone you have been within six feet of for at least 15 minutes.

Indoor and outdoor venues of assembly

Social gatherings (such as weddings, parties, networking events):

- Indoor: limit of 15 people; events with a licensed caterer can have up to 50 people
- Outdoor: limit of 15 people; events with a licensed caterer can have up to 100 people
- The smaller the group, the lower the risk.

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Public events and venues of assembly (such as performances, festivals):

- Indoor: limit of 125 people, or up to 66% capacity with six-foot spacing between people
- Outdoor: limit of 250 people, or up to 66% capacity with six-foot spacing between people
- Organizations are required to submit a plan to the Department of Business Regulation (DBR) for any event at which there will be more than 250 in attendance. <u>Submit the plan to DBR</u> online or use the Event Template: <u>COVID-19 Control Plan</u>.

Other places of public interaction (such as retail, restaurants, gyms, museums, close-contact business, office-based businesses, parks, beaches):

- Indoor venues operating at a percent capacity in a previous phase can increase up to 66% capacity while keeping six-foot spacing between people.
- Indoor venues operating at a square footage capacity in a previous phase can increase to up to one
 person per 100 square feet while keeping six-foot spacing between people.

Halloween and COVID-19

Farmer's markets and agri-tourism

- Activities may include corn mazes, hay rides, farm tours, and pumpkin or apple picking.
- Vendors and operators selling agricultural and seafood products at farmer's markets, on-farm markets, agri-tourism sites, and pick-your own farms should refer to Phase III guidelines for farmer's markets, on-farm markets and agritourism, and pick-your-own farms.
- Farmer's markets, on-farm markets and agri-tourism, and pick-your-own farms must develop a <u>COVID-19 Control Plan</u> which shall be available for inspection by the Task Force.

Recreation and entertainment

- Activities may include historical and cultural sites, such as museums and art galleries; entertainment
 establishments, such as movie theaters, performing arts venues, and comedy clubs; and spectator
 sports.
- Recreational and entertainment establishments and nonstate-owned historical and cultural sites should refer to the <u>Phase III Guidelines for Recreational</u>, <u>Historical</u>, <u>Cultural</u>, <u>and Entertainment</u> Establishments.
- All indoor and outdoor recreational and entertainment establishments that are not venues of assembly, including historic and cultural establishments, must develop a <u>COVID-19 Control Plan</u> which shall be available for inspection by the Task Force.

Food services

- Activities may include limited indoor dining in addition to outdoor dining (subject to applicable municipal approval) as well as pick-up, delivery, and drive-through operations.
- Restaurants, cafeterias, other food service establishments, breweries, distilleries, farmer wineries, and bars should refer to <u>Phase III Guidelines for Restaurants</u>.
- All restaurants operating in Phase III must develop a <u>COVID-19 Control Plan</u> which shall be available for inspection by the Task Force.

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
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
