READING from the Acts of the Apostles

In the preceding book, Theophilus, I was concerned with everything Jesus did and taught from the beginning, until the day he was taken up, after giving commandments through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. To them also he showed himself alive after his passion by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about God's kingdom. And since You are gracious God and Lover of mankind, forgive them every sin they have committed by thought, or word, or deed, for there is not a man who lives and does not sin: You alone are without sin, your righteousness is everlasting, and your word is

For You are the Resurrection and the Life, and the Repose of your departed servants, O Christ our God, and we render glory to You, together with your Eternal Father and your Allholy, Good and Life-giving Spirit, now and always and forever and ever. Amen.





What Is the Resurrection of Jesus?

"If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain. We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:14-15). With these words Saint Paul explains quite drastically what faith in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ means for the Christian message overall: it is its very foundation. The Christian faith stands or falls with the truth of the testimony that Christ is risen from the dead.

If this were taken away, it would still be possible to piece together from the Christian tradition a series of interesting ideas about God and men, about man's being and his obligations, a kind of religious world view: but the Christian faith itself would be dead. Jesus would be a failed religious leader, who despite his failure remains great and can cause us to reflect. But he would then remain purely human, and his authority would extend only so far as his message is of interest to us. He would no longer be a criterion; the only criterion left would be

our own judgment in selecting from his heritage what strikes us as helpful. In other words, we would be alone. Our own judgment would be the highest instance.

Therefore it is necessary to listen with particular attention as the New Testament bears witness to the Resurrection. Yet first we have to acknowledge that this testimony, considered from a historical point of view, is presented to us in a particularly complex form and gives rise to many questions.

- 1) We are to be a Resurrection people: Easter, the feast of the Resurrection, gives us the joyful message that we are a "Resurrection people." This means that we are not supposed to lie buried in the tomb of our sins, evil habits and dangerous addictions. It gives us the Good News that no tomb can hold us down anymore not the tomb of despair, discouragement or doubt, nor that of death. Instead, we are expected to live a joyful and peaceful life, constantly experiencing the real presence of the Risen Lord in all the events of our lives. "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad" (Psalm 118:24).
- 2) We need to seek our peace and joy in the Risen Jesus: The living presence of the Risen Lord gives us lasting peace and celestial joy in the face of the boredom, suffering, pain and tensions of our day-to-day life. "Peace be with you!" was His salutation to His disciples at all post-Resurrection appearances. For the true Christian, every day must be an Easter Day, lived joyfully in the close company of the Risen Lord
- 3) We are to be transparent Christians: We are called to be transparent Christians, showing others, through our lives of love, mercy, compassion and self-sacrificing service, that the Risen Jesus is living in our hearts.
- 4) We need to live new, disciplined lives in the Risen Jesus: Our awareness of the all-pervading, loving presence of the Risen Lord in and around us, and the strong conviction of our own coming resurrection, help us control our thoughts, desires, words and



behavior. These salutary thoughts inspire us to honor our bodies, keeping them holy, pure and free from evil habits and addictions. Our conviction that the Risen Lord is present in our neighbors and in all those we encounter should encourage us to respect them, and to render them loving, humble and selfless service.

5) We need to remember Easter in our Good Fridays: Easter reminds us that every Good Friday in our lives will have an Easter Sunday and that Jesus will let us share the power of His Resurrection. Each time we display our love of others, we share in the Resurrection. Each time we face a betrayal of trust, we share in the Resurrection of Jesus. Each time we fail in our attempts to ward off temptations - but keep on trying to overcome them - we share in the Resurrection. Each time we continue to hope - even when our hope seems unanswered - we share in the power of Jesus' Resurrection.

In short, the message of Easter is that nothing can destroy us — not pain, sin, rejection or death — because Christ has conquered all these, and we too can conquer them if we put our Faith in Him.

- 6) We are to be bearers of the Good News of Resurrection power. Resurrection is Good News, but at the same time, it's sometimes painful because it involves death. Before the power of the Resurrection can take hold in our own lives, we're called to die to sin, to die to self. We may even have to die to our own dreams, so that God can do what He wants to do with our lives. Resurrection is about seeing our world in a new way. Early that Easter morning, Mary Magdalene did not find what she was looking for, the dead body of Jesus. But she found something better than she could have imagined: The Risen Jesus. Sometimes, the things we think we want most are not granted to us. What we get instead is an experience of God's new ways of working in the world. That's the power of the Resurrection. When those moments come, we must spread the news--just as Mary Magdalene did: We have seen the Lord!
- 7) We need to be Easter people: We are in truth called to be an "Easter people", because there are many Easter moments in our lives. It may be in prayer, when for a moment we really experience the love of God, especially having felt His absence, as we often do, like the disciples who experienced the emptiness of the tomb. It may be that moment when we are touched and given hope by a word of Scripture like the disciples on the road to Emmaus when their hearts were uplifted in joy and hope as the Lord opened up the scriptures to them. Or it may be a moment during the sacrament of reconciliation, after we have acknowledged honestly our weakness and selfishness, our sinfulness and come to experience his forgiveness. Indeed, there are times in our lives when we know, through Faith, that the times of calm after the storm, of joy after sorrow, of restored vitality after weary days on our journey of Faith, are truly times when we share in his paschal mystery

ان قيامة يسوع حققت ما قد تنبا يسوع نفسه لتلاميذه " أَنَّ ابنَ الإِنسانِ يَجِبُ علَيهِ أَن يُعانِيَ آلاماً شديدة، وأَن يُوتَل، وأَن يُقتَل، وأَن يقومَ بَعدَ ثَلاثةِ أَيَّام" (مرقس 8: 31). فقيامة يسوع حققت نبوءة علامة يونان " فكما بَقِيَ يُونانُ في بَطنِ الحُوتِ ثَلاثة أَيَّامٍ وثلاثَ لَيال، فكذلكَ يَبقى ابنُ الإِنسانِ في جَوفِ الأَرضِ ثَلاثة أَيَّامٍ وثلاثَ لَيال" (متى 12: 40). وقيامة يسوع هي أيضاً علامة الهيكل كما اشار يسوع الى ذلك بقوله "أنقُضوا هذا الهَيكل أُقِقهُ في ثَلاثَةٍ أَيَّام" (يوحنا 22-11).

- قيامة يسوع تحقيق الوعود

حققت القيامة وعد رفع يسوع ممجدا الى يمين الله "فداودُ لم يَصعَدْ إلى السَّموات، وهُو نَفْسُه مع ذلك يَقول: قالَ الرَّبُّ لِرَبِيِّ: اِجلِسْ عن يَميني" (اعمال الرسل 2: 34) كما حققت القيامة تمجيد عبد الرب "لِيَجرِيّ الشِّفاءُ والآياتُ والأعاجيبُ بِاسِمِ عَبدِكَ القُدُّوسِ يَسوعِ" (اعمال الرسل 4:30) كما حققت القيامة ايضا الوعد بجلوس يسوع عن يمين الله "ها إِنِّي أَرى السَّمواتِ مُتَفَتَّحَة، وابنَ الإنسانِ قائِمًا عن يَمين الله" (اعمال الرسل 7: 56).

- القيامة هي مركز الكرازة الرسولية

وتقوم كرازة الرسل على ان يسوع قد صلب ومات، الا ان الله اقامه، وبه يُقدَّم للناس الخلاص كما صحَّح بطرس الرسول "قَتلتُم سيِّدَ الحَياة، فأقامَه اللهُ مِن بَينِ الأموات، ونَحنُ شُهودٌ على ذلك" (اعمال الرسول 3: 14-15). ويؤكِّد لنا بولس الرسول ايضا إيمان الجماعة الأولى بالقيامة، حيث يقول "سَلَّمتُ إليكم قبلَ كُلَّ شيَّءٍ ما تَسَلَّمتُه أنا أَيضًا، وهو أنَّ المسيخَ ماتَ مِن أَجْلِ خَطايانا كما وَرَدَ فِي الكُتُب، وأنَّه فُرَ وقامَ فِي اليَومِ الثَّالِثِ كما وَرَدَ فِي الكُتُب" (1 قوربتس 15: 3-4). "وإن كانَ المسيخُ لم يَقُمُ، فتَبشيرُنا باطِلٌ وإيمانُكُم أَيضًا باطِلّ (1 قورنتس 14:15). وان رؤساء اليهود لم يكنبوا حقيقة القيامة بل اكتفوا بالبحت عن تفسير آخر له وذلك برشوة رجال الحرس بقولهم لهم "قولوا إنَّ تَلاميذَه جاؤوا ليلاً فسَرقوه ونحنُ نائمون" (مق 28: 13). ويمكننا أن نلقب سفر الأعمال ببشارة القيامة. للجماعة المسيحية الأولى القيامة لها الأهمّية الأولى إذ بدون قيامة الربّ لما قامت الكنيسة المسيحية على الإطلاق.



- القيامة هي عربون قيامتنا

قيامة المسيح هي موضوع إيماننا واساس رجائنا في القيامة في اليوم الاخير. قام يسوع باعتباره "باكورة الراقدين (1 قورنتس 15:20) وهو "أوَّلُ القائمينَ مِن بَينِ الأَموات" (أعمال الرسل 26: 23). فنحن نقوم، لان يسوع قد قام "فالَّذي أقامَ يسوعَ المسيحَ مِن بَينِ الأُموات يُحْيي أيضًا أجسادَكُمُ الفانِية بِرُوحِه الحالِّ فيكُم" (رومة 8: 11). ويقول الرسول بطرس أننا قد فيكُم" (رومة 8: 11). ويقول الرسول بطرس أننا قد المسيح من الموت "بَبارَكَ اللهُ أبو ربِّنا يسوعَ المسيح، شَمَلنا بِوافِرِ رَحمَتِه فوَلدَنا فإنِيةً لِرَجاءٍ خِيِّ بقِيامَةِ يسوعَ المسيح، من بَينِ الأُموات" (1 بطرس 1، 3). ويصرّح المسيح مِن بَينِ الأُموات" (1 بطرس 1، 3). ويصرّح بولس الرسول " نَنتَظِرُ مَجِيءَ المُخلِّصِ الرّبِّ يسوعَ المسيح، الذي سيُغيَّرُ هيئَة جَسَدِنا الحَقير فيَجعَلُه على طورة جَسَدِه المَجيد بما لَه مِن قُدرَةٍ يُخضِعُ بِها لِنَفْسِه صُورةٍ جَسَدِه المَجيد بما لَه مِن قُدرَةٍ يُخضِعُ بِها لِنَفْسِه كُلُّ شَيَء" (فيلبي 3: 12).

موقفنا تجاه القيامة

بعدما بحثنا في معاني قيامة المسيح يكشف يوحنا الإنجيلي عن مراحل نرتقي بها إلى معرفة القيامة وفهمها من خلال الانتقال من رؤية مريم المجدلية السطحية،

الى نظرة بطرس التحليلية، الرؤية التلميذ الحبيب وإيمانه. فمن خلال خبرة الرسل يمكن ان يتخذ المرء اربعة مراحل ليصل الى الايمان بقيامة يسوع من الاموات:

المرحلة الاولى: التساؤل

قد يظن المرء ان القيامة مجرد تلفيق يُستحال تصديقه او فكرة إمكانية خطف الجثة كما كان الحال مع مريم المجدلية التي تساءلت امام القبر الفارغ " أَخَذوا الرَّبَّ مِنَ القَبْرِ، ولا نَعلَمُ أَينَ وَصَعوه"" (يوحنا 20: 2). فقد رأت مريم المجدلية كما يرى كل إنسان بحاسة النظر ولم تفقه بعد سبب القبر الفارغ ولم تدخل اليه. والجدير بالذكر ان انجيل يوحنا أشار بان مريم المجدلية كانت وحدها عند القبر دون ذكر سائر النسوة، لأنها مثل توما ترمز الى الذين يحتاجون الى ان يروا لكي يعمنها.

المرحلة الثانية: التحليل والايمان

تقوم المرحلة الثانية بتحقق المرء من الحقائق كما هو الحال مع بطرس ويوحنا "دَخَلَ القَبُرُ فأَبصَرَ. اللَّفائِفَ مَمْدودة" (20: 6) رأى بطرس الاكفان مرتبة في مكانها على الارض واستدل مِن كل ما رأى ان جسد بسوع قد تحرر من اللفائف والمنديل ولكنه ظلَّ مذهولا من حدث القيامة؛ بطرس رأى وتعجب كما يصفه لوقا الإنجيلي "غيرَ أنَّ بُهُرُس قام فأسرَعَ إلى القَبُرِ وانحنَى، فلَم يَنِ إلاَّ اللَّفائِف، فأنصَرَفَ إلى بيتِه مُتَعَجَّباً مِمَّا جَرى" (لوقا 24: 12)، اما يوحنا الحبيب "فرأى وآمنَ" (يوحنا 20 :8). فهم يوحنا فورا لغة القبر الفارغ، والاكفان الممدودة، والمنديل ملفوفا على حدة. فهذه التفاصيل تنفي سرقة الجسد. فآمن بقيامة الرب. وعلى إيمان الرسل ثبت إيمان الكنيسة. وليس الإيمان تصديق الأشياء التي تتناقض مع العقل، بل هو فوق وما وراء العقل كما جاء في تعليم صاحب الرسالة الى العبرانيين "فالإيمان قوامُ الأمورِ الّتي تُرْجى وبُرُهانُ الحَقائِقِ الّتي لا مُرى" (عبرانيّن 11، 1). إنّ أساس الإيمان المسيحي هو أحداثاً جرت بالفعل، من شهادة شهود عيان مدرية المنتقة

يسوع المسيح هو شخصيا "القِيامةُ والحَياة مَن آمَنَ بِي، وَإِن ماتَ، فسَيَحْيا" (يوحنا 11: 25). وهو يُشركنا منذ الآن في الحياة الجديدة عن طريق علامات اسرار الكنيسة. فالحياة الجديدة التي دخلنا فيها ليست شيئا آخر سوى حياته ذاتها كشخص قام من بين الاموات "مع أَنَّنا كُنَّا أَمُواتًا بِزَلاَّتِنا، أَحْيانا مع المَسيح (بِالنِّعمةِ نِلتُمُ الخَلاص) وأقامَنا معه وأجلَسَنا معه في السَّمَواتِ في المسيح يسوع (أفسس 2: 5-6). إن ايماننا بقيامة يسوع يوجّه كل كياننا المسيحي "أمَّا وقد قُمتُم مع المسيح، فاسعَوا إلى الأُمورِ الَّتِي في العُلى حَيثُ المسيحُ قد جَلَسَ عن يَمينِ الله". (قولسي 3: 1).

أيها الرب يسوع المسيح، يا من غلبت الموت وخرجت من ظلمة القبر منتصراً ونقض موتك موتنا وبقيامتك اعدت الحياة الينا، امنحنا رُوحَك القدوس وأظهر غفرانك وسلامك وفرحك في قلوبنا وحياتنا فنشَهد بِفَمِنا أنَّ يسوعَ رَبِّ، ونؤمن بِقَلبِنا أنَّ اللهَ أقامَه مِن بَينِ الأَموات، ونكون شُهودًا لقيامتك على مثال الرسل " فلا نَستَطيحُ الشُّكوتَ عن ذِكْر ما رَأَينا وما سَمِعْنا وما اختبرنا" (اعمال الرسل 4: 21)، ونشع هذا الايمان للجميع منشدين مع الكنيسة "المسيح قام من بين الأموات ووهب الحياة للّذين في القبور".



Alerts and Latest Guidance

- •Social Gatherings: as of October 30, the indoor and outdoor social gathering limit is 10 people because social gatherings have been the source of many positive cases.
- •Early closures: All restaurants, bars, gyms, recreational facilities, and personal services must close at 10 p.m. Sunday Thursday and at 10:30 p.m. on Friday and Saturday. (Effective November 8, 2020)
- •Stay-at-home advisory is in effect from 10 p.m. 5 a.m. Sunday Thursday and from 10:30 p.m. 5 a.m. on Friday and Saturday. (*Effective November 8, 2020*)
- •Venues of assembly: The capacity limit for indoor venues (performing arts venues, movie theaters, houses of worship) is 50% of normal capacity with a maximum of 125 people. The limit for outdoor venues is 66% of normal capacity with a maximum of 150 people. (*Effective November 8, 2020*)
- •Catered events: The capacity limit for indoor catered events is 25 and for outdoor catered events is 75, with exceptions for previously scheduled weddings. (*Effective November 8, 2020*)
- •Large retailers: The capacity limit for big box stores (more than 30,000 square feet of space) is one person per 150 square feet. (*Effective November 8, 2020*)
- •Business travel: Businesses are asked to cancel any non-essential, work-related travel. (*Effective November* 8, 2020)
- •Masks are required any time you're near people who don't live with you, including at the gym.

REOPENING RI

Wear a mask that protects you and others

Wearing a face covering in public places helps protect you and anyone near you from COVID-19. Your mask should fit snugly but comfortably over your nose, mouth, and chin without any gaps.



RECOMMENDED

- Face mask worn the right way and at least two layers thick
- N-95 respirators are critical supplies that should be reserved for healthcare providers and other first responders



NOT RECOMMENDED

- Face shield alone
- Loose-fitting bandana
- Face mask with valve
- Face mask worn the wrong way
- Neck gaiter only one layer thick
