Why did you doubt?



Put yourself in the scene of today's gospel. Waves are pounding a little wooden fishing boat as a storm rages all around you when suddenly, through the blowing wind and water spray, you see someone or something walking on the water towards you. Quite disconcerting, wouldn't you say? Of course, the disciples think they are seeing a ghost until Jesus quells their fears. Remarkably Peter responds to this wonderous sight by boldly declaring,

"Lord, if it is you, bid me come to you on the water."

Now that is a sign of great faith for me. Jesus invites Peter out to join him by merely saying come.

"Come."

Without hesitation, Peter gets out of the boat and walks on the water.

WOW.

Peter actually walks on the water.

Nobody talks about that shining few seconds of miraculous faith. No, commentators focus on Peter's lack of faith.

Would you have gotten out of that boat while the sea rolled beneath your feet?

Could you have walked on water like Peter did, even if it was only for a few moments?

Of course when Peter takes his eyes off his Saviour and actually looks at the wind, the reality of his situation hits him and he begins to sink. Yet Peter does not get any sympathy or even any praise for having actually walked on water, albeit it, only for a few steps. Nope. Jesus is quite harsh,

"O man of little faith, why did you doubt?"

Ponder: Why is Jesus so stern with poor Peter?

It is because this story will illustrate, for future Christians, our basic walk with God. We are called to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, our sole Saviour and Redeemer. We can't do anything on our own strength. No matter what our circumstances are, when our eyes are fixed on our Lord, anything and everything is possible. This is the normal Christian life. It is not for a select few. Jesus expects us to walk on water with him, daily.

Pray: I believe; Lord heal my disbelief.

This story presents lessons for life that go beyond what meets the eye:

- Making room for God: Jesus sent the disciples away so that he could go alone to the mountainside and pray. Even with his busy schedule, Jesus made spending time with God a top priority. The story reminds Christians of the importance of setting aside room for God.
- Recognizing the Lord: Even though the disciples had been with Jesus for a long time, they didn't recognize him as he approached in the storm. The story reminds Christians that they may not recognize the Lord when he comes to them in the middle of their own personal storms.
- Keeping focused on Jesus: Peter did not begin to sink until he started looking around at the wind and the waves. For Christians, the lesson is that when they take their eyes off of Jesus and focus on their difficult circumstances, they begin to sink under the weight of their problems. If we cry out to Jesus in faith, he will catch us by the hand and raise us above seemingly impossible surroundings.
- Restoring faith after a lapse: When he left the boat, Peter started out with good intentions, but his faith faltered. Nevertheless, Peter's leap of faith did not end in failure. Even in his fear, he cried out to the Lord, knowing that Jesus was the only one who could help him. Peter's experience reminds Christians that a lapse of faith is merely a lapse and that the Lord is still there for believers when they call for him.
- Weathering the storm with Jesus: When Jesus climbed into the boat, the storm ceased. Believers can rest assured that when they have Jesus in their boat, he will calm the stormy waters of life.

ونتساءل أين هو الله؟ في الحقيقة إنه قريبٌ منا لكنه يأتي دوماً في الهزيع الرابع من الليل، يتركنا نجدف لنكسب خبرة في مقاومة التيار، إنه يريدنا رجالاً في الحياة. فالمسيح لم يترك تلاميذه طويلا وحدهم بلا مساعدة، بل أتى إليهم لبشجعهم ويزيل اضطرابهم. إن الإيمان هو زادٌ ضروري لنا نحن الموجودون في وسط اضطراب العالم الحاضر، فلنثق بالرب المحب والقادر على كل شيء، ولئعد تربية نفوسنا على الإلفة مع الإله الحقيقي بواسطة العزلة والصلاة اللئين تساعدان المسيحي على أن يذوق حلاوة معاشرة الرب ويميز الفرق الكبير بين هدوء الرب وسلامه وبين ضجيح العالم واضطرابه.

وإذا عشنا حياًة روحيّة نختبر ونتأكد من أنه بالصلاة إليه "يا رب نجني" سيسرع الـرب فوراً كمعين ومخـلـص ويُتهضنا ويحمينا من الأخطار. فليُبادر كلَّ واحدٍ منا بالالتجاء إليه والارتماء في أحضانه، فعبارته "تشجعوا أنا هـو لا تخافوا" هي وعدٌ لنا نحن المرميّون وسـط بحر العمر وأحزانه، أنه سـيكون إلى جانبنا "إلى انقضاء الدهر".

في الهزيع الرابع من الليل جاء المسيح لينقذ تلاميذه. لقد رآهم من بعيد، وعرف احتياجهم فأسرع لنجدتهم. وأليس هذا ما يجري معنا؟ في كل ضيقنا يتضايق، وملاك حضرته يخلّصنا (إشعياء ٦٣: ٩).

في ساعات ما قبل الشروق جاء المسيح ماشياً على الماء لينقذ تلاميذه من الغرق، فأشرقت عليهم شمس يِّرِه، بنور خلاصه.

يسمع الله صلاتنا من على بُعد، ويدرك أعوازنا فيتحرك ليساعدنا، فالله فقال في الزمن والتاريخ، وهو حي في سهائه وعلى أرضنا، يعمل مشيئته في سهائه لأن ملائكته يخدمونه ويسبحونه نهاراً وليلاً، لكل واحد منهم سستة أجنحة ليتجه إلى حيثما يوجحه الله (إشعياء ٦: ٢). والله يجيئنا بنفسه أو بملائكته، أو بواسطة شعبه وخدامه الذين يمدّون لنا يد العون.

ولكن التلاميذ عندما رأوا المسيح قادماً نحوهم ظنوه خيالاً وخافوا أكثر.

كانوا خائفين من الأمواج، وممن ظنوه خيالًا، مع أنه جاء ليساعدهم! ولكن المسيح بدَّد الخوفين معاً عـنـدمـا قـال لهم: »تَشَجَّعُوا! أنَا هُوَ. لا تَخَافُوا«

وهمنا قال بطرس: ﴿إِنْ كُنْتَ أَنْتَ هُوَ، فَمُرْنِي أَنْ آتِيَ إِلَيْكَ عَلَى ٱلْمَاءِ «فأمره المسيح بذلك، فنزل من السـفـيـنــة ومشى على صفحة الماء.

ولكن ما أن حوَّل نظره من المسيح إلى الماء الهائج من حوله حتى بدأ يغرق.

لكنه حتى في هذا الموقف نتعلم من بطرس درسًا هامًا، فهو بمجرد أن بدأ يغرق، صرخ للرب. قال له كلمات بسيطة، لكنها نابعة من الأعماق: »يا رب نجني .«وهي تُعتبر أقصر صلاة في الكتاب المقدس، ونالت استجابة فورية. فالصلاة ليست بطولها تُقاس، بل بعمقها.

عندما تشتد العواصف حولك من كل الجهات ثبت نظرك على الرب يسوع الذي يشفي كل أمراضك.

ابذل اجتهاداً. اقرأ الكلمة أكثر وعِش في جو ومناخ القديسين.

احترس من أوقات الفراغ. احفظ آيات من الكتاب لتجاوب العدو من المكتوب.

راجع إحسانات الرب معك في الماضي، وقُل لنفسك: لماذا أنتِ منحنية يا نفسي، قومي ترجي الله. وإن شعرت أنك ابتدأت تغرق، اصرخ قائلاً: يا رب نجني، ففي الحال يمد الرب يده، يمسـك بـك ويـنـقـذك، فتدخل السفينة والريح قد سكنت.

هذه المعجزة مزدوجة: هدأ المسيح البحر للتلاميذ جميعاً، وجعل بطرس يمشي على الماء وأنقذه من الغرق. وهذا ما يحدث معنا، فالمسيح يُجري معنا لا معجزة واحدة بل معجزات، حتى أننا كثيراً ما ننسى. المعجزات الصغيرة في انهارنا بالمعجزة الكبيرة! فُلتَقُلُ كداود: »بَارِكِي يَا نَفْسِي ٱلرَّبَّ، وَلا تَنْسَيْء كُلَّ حَسَسَاتِهِ «(مزمور ١٠٣: ٢).

أجرى المسيح معجزات على اليابسة، وعلى الماء، فهو رب الأرض والبحر، القادر أن يفعل هنا وهناك، ولا يوجد مكان لا تمتد إليه يد قدرته. لقد أطعم الجانعين، وسكّن الماء الهائج، فنقول له: »اَلرَبُّ رَاعِيَّ فَلا يُعْوِزُنِي شَيْءٌ. فِي مَرَاعِ خُضْرِ يُرْضُنِي. إلى مِيَاهِ الرَّاحَةِ يُورِدُنِي «(مزمور ٢٣: ١ ، ٢). ففي هاتين المعجزتين نرى كيف أطعمهم، ثم كيف أوردهم إلى مياه الراحة!

لماذا ترك المسيح التلاميذ على صفحة الماء؟

نحن لا ندرك الحكمة الإلهية دائمًا. وفي مرات كثيرة نسأل الله: لماذا فعلت بنا هكذا؟ لكننا نحتاج دائمًا أن نسـلّم له، لأننا وان كنا لا ندرك حكمته، لكننا ندرك أنه يحبنا.

صرخ التلاميذ، وجَيِّدٌ أن يصرخ المؤمن ليعلن ضعفه وعجزه ونقص حكمته وعدم قدرته على إنقاذ نفسه. وعندهـا تجيئه النجاة الإلهية: »تشجعوا. أنا هو. لا تخافوا.«

جاء في الهزيع الرابع من الليل. يتذمر مؤمنون كثيرون على الله لأنهم يعتقدون أنه يتركهم وسط التعب. لكن أناة الله تصوغ حياتهم، وتعلمهم من خلال تجاربهم. فهو لا يأتي في توقيتنا نحن بل في توقيته الحكيم. إنها حكمة المعلم... حكمة الأب. إنه مثل منقذٍ لمن يتعرَّض للغرق، يترك المسكين لثوانٍ محسوبة، إلى أن يصير مستعداً للتسليم، فيحمله لشاطئ النجاة.

مرة أسكت المسيح العاصفة وهو موجود مع التلاميذ في القارب، وفي هذه المرةكان غائبًا عنهم. كان يريد أن يعلّمهم أنه حتى وإن كان غائبًا عنهم بالجسد لكنه موجود معهم بروحه. في الإنقاذ الأول رأوه بأعينهم يُسكت العاصفة، ولكن في الإنقاذ الثاني رأوه يجيء من بعيد. و »طُوبَي لِلْذِينَ آمَنُوا وَلَمْ يَرَوْا «(يوحنا ٢٠: ٢٩).

عزيزي القارئ، ليس المهم أن تراه، بل أنه هو يراك. ليس المهم أن تمسك به، بل أنه هو يمسك بك. عندئذٍ تراه وتمسك به، وقد امتلأ قلبك بالطمأنينة والفرح.

الرب دائماً يشجّع أبناءه قائلاً: »أنا هُوَ. لا تَخَافُوا «(مرقس ٦: ٥٠). كما أنه يريدهم أن يكونوا دائماً في سلام: »سَلاماً أثرُكُ لَكْ. سَلامِي أُعْطِيكُمْ لِنَسَ كما يُعْطِي الْقَالَمُ أَعْطِيكُمْ أَنَا «(يوحنا ١٤: ٢٧). لأن عطية العالم محدودة يختلط معها السلام بالقلق، لكن سلام الرب صاف وواضح. هو الذي أمسك بيد بطرس: »مَدَّ يسوع يده وأمسك به «(آية ٣١) ولم يوتخ ضعف إيمان تلميذه إلا بعد أن رفعه فوق البحر الهائج! لم يقل له: لماذا جئت إلى؟ فمن حق بطرس أن يجيء للرب. ولكنه قال له: »يا قليل الإيمان، لماذا شككت؟ «(آية ٣١). فمن حق المؤمن أن يطلب من الله، لكن ليس من حقه أن يشك في محبة الله.

LITURGY OR MASS INTENTIONS



Mass intentions can be scheduled for those who have died, and on the occasion of a birthday, wedding anniversary, for healing for the conversion of sinners, for the grace to face the challenges in life, for the success in a new job, for those serving in the church and country in different levels, for good weather, bountiful harvest, for world peace, in thanksgiving for the blessings received, etc. You can find so many reasons to think about a Mass offering. We offer the Mass for a specific intention because we believe in the immense spiritual value of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

The custom of giving offering to have Liturgies said for specific intentions is a laudable one and should be maintained as much as possible. Church teaching and Canon Law (nos. 942-958) provide important guidelines on how to preserve the dignity and appreciation of this practice. Overall, it should be well noted that Liturgy offerings are never to be viewed as a means of parish fundraising.

<u>COMMEMORATIONS OF THE DEAD</u>: The Apostolic Constitutions refer to the repetition of the Mass on the third, ninth and fortieth days: "Let the third day be observed in remembrance of the dead with psalms, lessons, and prayers, because Christ rose from the dead on the third day. Let the ninth day be observed in remembrance both of the living and the dead, and also the fortieth day, in accordance with mourning customs of the Israelites at the time of Moses' death. Finally, let the anniversary day be observed in memory of the dead."

In contemporary Byzantine practice, the dead are commemorated on the ninth and fortieth days and on the anniversary of their departure from this world.


Formerly under the jurisdiction of the local Latin Ordinaries before the Exarchate was established under the leadership of the late Bishop Justin Najmy of this Parish, all Melkites have been subject to the latter since its erection in 1966. The Constitution of the Melkite Eparchy which is now a sole Diocese since 1976 still acknowledges this definitive protocol. Our parishes follow local discipline in the various customs e.g., clergy attire, stipends (Mass Offerings), etc. except in Liturgy and Ritual. Our relationship with the local Latin Dioceses and Latin pastors must be permeated with a spirit of love and friendship and cooperation.

Effective January 1, 2008, which by-passed us, the schedule of offerings for Masses in parishes is now \$25.00; Funerals: \$300.00; Weddings: \$300.00.

Canon Law prohibits accepting stipends or offerings for Masses more than one year in advance (rolling calendar) Canon 953. The time within which Masses must be celebrated (1 year) begins the day the intention is received (Canon 955 #2.)

May the memories of our beloved deceased be eternal and many thanks for your understanding and undivided attention in regard to these guidelines and restrictions.

The House of God Etiquette (Page 1 of 2)

WHEN YOU ARRIVE AT CHURCH:

- Remind yourself why you are here: Jesus Christ. You have an appointment every Sunday morning at 10:30am with Him, so you should not be late. Would you be late to any other appointment? Get extra rest so that you can make it to Church on time.
- •Shut off all beepers, phones, and electronic devices. NO text messaging!
- •As we sing in the Liturgy, "Let us lay aside all earthy care."
- When entering the Church, venerate/kiss the icon at the entrance, cross yourself in prayer, and light a candle.

YOU MAY NOT ENTER THE CHURCH AT THE FOLLOWING PERIODS:

- During the Entrance of the Holy Gospel
- •During the reading of the Epistle and the Holy Gospel
- During the Sermon
- During the Entrance of the Holy Gifts

If you arrive during the above mentioned times, please wait at the back of the church. When you enter or exit the Church, use only the side aisles. No one is to use the middle aisle at any time during the service, except for the Communion line.



YOU SHOULD NOT BE SEATED DURING THE FOLLOWING MOMENTS:

- The singing of the Great Doxology ("Glory to Thee who has shown us the Light")
- •At "Blessed is the Kingdom of the Father, Son, and of the Holy Spirit..."
- During the Entrance of the Holy Gospel
- •During the reading of the Holy Gospel
- During the Entrance of the Gifts
- During the Consecration of the Gifts
- •During the Creed and the Lord's Prayer ("Our Father")
- While the priest and deacon are distributing Holy Communion
- Any time the priest blesses you with his hand or the cross

CONDUCT IN CHURCH:

It is important to keep a reverent attitude and demeanor in Church at all times.

- •Be on time! The proper time to arrive is **before** the service begins.
- •Should you have an emergency and think you will be late to Church, still come, pray, and give thanks to God for all things!
- •You are there to pray, so focus on the prayers and hymns of the Liturgy
- •Do not cross your legs while seated; please be firm while standing
- Do not stand with your hands in your pockets
- Do not chew gum; absolutely no eating or drinking
- •Do not talk during the Divine Liturgy, especially during the Gospel reading and in Communion line (wait until Coffee Hour to say hello)
- •Communion is not the end of Liturgy; do not leave until Liturgy is completely over and you have kissed the cross. You may not go to the Hall during Liturgy.



MAKING THE SIGN OF THE CROSS:

The sign of the Cross is extremely powerful due to the reminder it gives of Christ's sacrifice. Tracing the sign of the Cross on ourselves serves as the accepting of that sacrifice and the blessing to emulate it in our everyday life. Making the sign of the Cross is the reception of the blessing bestowed on you by the Bishop or the Priest. It is the pious custom of devout people to trace themselves with the sign of the cross at important parts of the Divine Liturgy.



- •At the beginning and end of prayers and services
- Upon entering Church and leaving Church
- •At the mention of the "Father, Son, and Holy Spirit"
- When offering glory or blessedness to God
- At any prayerful invocation of God
- •When the priest exclaims "Peace be to all"



The House of God Etiquette .. Continued

- •When the priest blesses the faithful with his hand or cross
- •When the priest censes the people
- During the Entrance of the Holy Gospel
- During the Trisagion Prayers or Hymn (Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy...)
- After receiving Holy Communion (after you have taken a few steps away from the chalice)

BOWING YOUR HEAD:

There are certain times in the service when parishioners should bow their heads:

- •When the priest exclaims "Peace be to all"
- •At the exclamation "Bow your heads unto the Lord"
- When the priest blesses the faithful with his hand or cross or censer
- •When the priest or deacon bows toward the people during the services
- •During the Entrance of the Holy Gospel
- When the Holy Gospel is read
- During the Entrance of the Gifts
- During the Consecration of the Gifts
- •When you feel you need to focus on the service as to not get distracted

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION:

To receive Holy Communion a person should:

- Prepare by prayer, by repentance, ultimately by receiving the Sacrament of Confession
- Prepare by fasting from food and drink (except for those with medical reasons) upon rising in the morning at lease an hour before
- •Refrain from smoking or chewing gum upon rising in the morning
- Ask forgiveness of anyone you have wronged
- Offer forgiveness to anyone who has wronged you
- Approach the chalice with reverence and thanksgiving, with arms crossed or hands folded with one's mind on Christ
- •Say your name to the priest as you approach the Holy Chalice
- •Tilt your head back and open your mouth as wide as you can
- You should NOT receive Holy Communion if you arrive to Church after the reading of the Gospel.
- •Quietly return to your place and recite the Thanksgiving prayers

CHURCH ATTIRE:

Use Good Judgment! Common Sense! We should offer Christ our "Sunday Best", not our everyday or common wear. Our dress should always be becoming of a Christian, and exemplify Christian values.

- No Sleeveless T-Shirts, No Tank-tops, No Sunglasses on head (or baseball caps)
- No Gym Shoes, No shorts, No Flip-Flops
- Dresses and skirts must fall below the knee and must be worn loosely; not tight
- Ladies' blouses should not be revealing and must cover the chest and shoulders
- Excessive make-up must be avoided. Women who wear lipstick should make sure lips are dry before receiving Communion, kissing cross or the priest's hand.
- •This attire is to be for all ages!
- This attire is to help us realize how to respect our bodies, the Church, and to properly offer up prayer for our sins
- This attire is to help us NOT become a distraction to others who are trying to focus themselves







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
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
