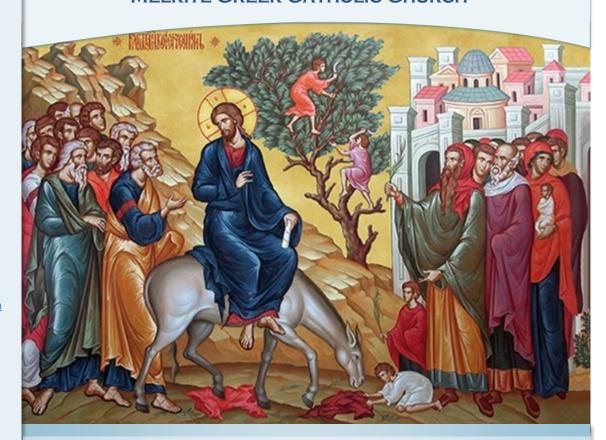

Palm Sunday The Glorious Entry into Jerusalem

Antiphon Prayer

O Christ God, You prefigured for us your glorious Resurrection when You raised your friend Lazarus from the tomb. Wherefore, we your beloved people, offer You praise with pure mouths, praying You to make us worthy participants in your Holy Passion and your glorious Resurrection.

For it belongs to You to have mercy on us, O Christ our God, and to You we render glory, thanksgiving and worship, and to your Eternal Father and your All-holy, Good and Life-giving Spirit, now and always and forever and ever.

First Troparion of the Feast, Tone 1 (twice)

O Christ God, when You raised Lazarus from the dead, before the time of your passion, you confirmed the future resurrection of all. We too, like the children of old, carry before You the symbols of victory and cry out to You, O conqueror of Death: "Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!"

Second Troparion of the Feast, Tone 4 (once)

O Christ our God, we have been buried with You in baptism: wherefore we merited eternal life through your resurrection. We cry out to You, singing a hymn of praise: "Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!"

Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Philippians Brethren, rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say rejoice. Let your moderation be known to all men. The Lord is near. Have no anxiety, but in every prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your petitions be made known to God. And may God's peace that surpasses all understanding guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

For the rest, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever honorable, whatever just, whatever holy, whatever lovable, whatever of good repute, if there be any virtue, if anything is worthy of praise: consider these things. And what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, these things practice — and the God of peace will be with you. ALLELUIA (Tone 3) (SL. Tone 1)

Stichon: All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.

Gospel: Palm Sunday, John 12: 1-18

Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany the home of Lazarus, he had raised from the dead. And they made him a supper there; and Martha served, while Lazarus was one of those sitting at table with him. Mary therefore took a pound of ointment, genuine nard of great value, and anointed the feet of Jesus, and with her hair wiped his feet dry. And the house was filled with the odor of the ointment. Then one of his disciples, Judas son of Simon the Iscariot, the one who was about to betray him, said, "Why was this ointment not sold for three hundred denarii, and given to the poor?" Now he said this, not that he cared for the poor, but because he was a thief, and holding the purse, used to take what was put in it. Jesus therefore said, "Let her be: she was to keep it for the day of my burial. For the poor you have always with you, but you do not always have me." Now the great crowd of the Jews learned that he was there; and they came, not only because of Jesus, but that they might see Lazarus, the man he had raised from the dead. But the chief priests planned to put Lazarus to death also. For on his account many of the Jews began to leave them and to believe in Jesus. Now the next day the great crowd which had come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, took up palm fronds and went out to meet him. And they cried out, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord, the king of Israel!" And Jesus found a young ass, and sat upon it, as it is written, "Fear not, daughter of Sion; behold, thy king comes, sitting upon the colt of an ass." These things his disciples did not at first understand. But when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered these things were written about him, and that they had done these things to him. The crowd therefore, which was with him when he called Lazarus from the tomb and raised him from the dead, bore witness to him. And the reason why the' crowd also went to meet him was that they heard he had worked this sign.

وجوة وسط الزّحام في يوم دخول الرّب يسوع إلى أورشليم



وليصنع بداية جديدة

يحتلّ أحد الشعانين الذي تفسيره"هوشعنا أي خلّص يارب" ذروة حياة يسوع العلنيّة السائر إلى آلامه وموته كما يُبيّن لنا الإنجيلي يوحنا. في هذه المناسبة وللمرة الأولى، يعلن يسوع عن ذاته أنه "ملك إسرائيل" الداخل إلى عاصمة مُلكه أورشليم. في وسط تلك الهتافات توجّه يسوع إلى هيكل الله ليعيده بيت صلاة ومقرّاً للعبادة الحقيقية. فملكيّة يسوع بشكلها الشامل هي على مثال ملكيّة الله نفسه في أورشليم، وهذه الملكيّة تنطلق من إسرائيل لتصل إلى سائر الشعوب.

فمع أن الرّب يسوع لم يكن قد انتصر في معركة عسكرية. ولم تكن معه جيوش جرّارة. ولم يكن راكباً على مركبة تجرها خيول مزخرفة بالذهب والغار. إلَّا أن النَّاس هتفوا يومها له بصراخ لا يعلو إلا للملوك والعظماء، مع أنه جاء وديعاً ومتواضعاً وراكباً على أتان. جاء لكي يموت على الصّليب من أجلنا. جاء إلى أوروشليم لأنها مدينة الملك العظيم. زمن الموكب: تم دخول الرَّب يسوع إلى أوروشليم في بداية أسبوع الإحتفال بعيد الفصح عند اليهود. وبحسب شريعة العهد القديم، كان على اليهود المشتّتين في عدد من دول العالم أن يحضروا في موسم العيد إلى أوروشليم لتقديم ذبائح الفصح في الهيكل. وهكذا كان عشرات الآلاف، وربما مئات الآلاف، يحتشدون في أوروشليم في فترة عيد الفصح. يعني هذا الكلام بكل بساطة أن عدداً ضخماً من النّاس قد شاهد دخول موكب الرَّب يسوع إلى أوروشليم، وقد كان موكباً يضاهي مواكب القادة والملوك العظام، مع أن دخوله كان بطريقة متواضعة ومسالمة. فلم يكن على رأسه إكليل انتصار، ولم يكن راكباً حصاناً قوياً، بل على جحش إبن

. كان الرّب يعلم تماماً ما الذي ينتظره في أوروشليم من خيانةٍ واعتقالِ وتعذيب ومحكمةٍ وجلْدٍ وصلْبِ وموتٍ، ومع ذلك جاء إلى أوروشليم علناً لكي تتم كل نبوءات الله فيه. دخل الرّب يسوع أوروشليم متواضِعاً وراكباً على أتان. أي دخل بعمل رمزي يشير إلى أنَّه: 1. رئيس السّلام: دخل الرِّب يسوع أوروشليم بسلام، ولذلك لم تعترض على دخوله السلطات الرومانيّة التي كانت تحتل أوروشليم في أيام المسيح. فمن يركب حماراً ولا يحمل سلاحاً لا يهدد أمن الدولة، ولا يثير مشاكل لأحد، إلا لمن أراد أن يثار من محبة النّاس وهتافهم لرب المجد يسوع، وهم رجال الدّين بالتّحديد.

لو تفحصَّنا الجموع جيداً، لوجدنا أنه كان هنالك خمسة أنواع من النّاس وسط هذا الحشد الكبير:

أولاً: المؤمنون المكرّسون: المكرّسون هم الذين يتبعون الرّب يسوع ويخضعون لمشيئته، ويعترفون به رباً وسيداً لحياتهم، ويطيعونه إلى التمام، ويذهبون ويعملون ما يريده منهم، ويعطون من حياتهم طوعاً لمجد الرّب. وهؤلاء كانوا تلاميذه من الرسل وغيرهم. كما نقرأ في متى 6:21 "فَذَهَبَ التِّلْمِيذَانِ وَفَعَلاَ كَمَا أَمَرَهُمَا يَسُوعُ ".

ثانياً: المرتبكون والمحتارون والضائعون: وهم الأغلبية بين الجموع، وهم مثل الغنم الّتي لا راع لها. نقرأ في متى 10:21 "وَلَمَّا دَخَلَ أُورُشَلِيمَ ارْتَجَّتِ الْمَدِينَةُ كُلُّهَا قَائِلَةً: مَنْ هَذَا؟". فقال الجموع في الآية 11 "هَذَا يَسُوعُ النَّبِيُّ الَّذِي مِنْ نَاصِرَةِ الْجَلِيلِ". المرتبكون هم عادة الذين لا يعرفون حقيقة هوية الرّب يسوع. فالجموع في أوروشليم قالت أنه نبي. وكثيرون اليوم يؤمنون أنه مجرد نبي. ويوجد كثيرون اليوم، بمن فيهم الملحدون، يقولون أن يسوع كان معلماً مثالياً صالحاً، غير مدركين حقيقة شخصه بأنه الله القدوس البار. وحتى في كنائسنا المسيحية، وبين المحتفلين بذكري أحد الشعانين، نجد أن كثيرين لا يعرفون حقاً من هو يسوع: فهم لا يعرفون خطة الله لحياتهم، ويعتمدون على برهم الذاتي وعلى أعمالهم للخلاص. أي أنّهم يحتفلون بذكرى دخول الرّب يسوع الى أوروشليم دون أن يعرفوه نهائياً. كذلك فإن الضائعين والمرتبكين لا يفهمون رسالة الرّب يسوع والقصد من مجيئه، مثل سكان

أحد الشعانين هو أحد الأعياد السبعه المرتبطه بالقيامة، وله خصوصية في حياة السيد المسيح 🏿 أورشليم في أيام الرّب يسوع الذين اعتقدوا أنه جاء ليكون ملكاً أرضياً ويخلصهم من الاحتلال والكنيسة معًا، ويمتاز بعلامات مهمة فإنه يوم فرح ويوم خلاص فالمسيح جاء ليخلص الخطاة الروماني. وكثيرون مثلهم اليوم يرون في شخص الرّب وكأنه مصدر رزق مادي لهم، أو قارب نجاة لحياتهم الإجتماعيّة، ولكنهم لا يرونه سبباً لوجودهم ورباً ومخلصاً لحياتهم.

ثالثاً: المزيفون والمتظاهرون بالتقوى: على مدى تاريخ الكنيسة، كان المزيفون ومدّعو التقوى حاضرين في كل مكان وكل مناسبة "دينيّة"، وهم عادة من يجيدون تمثيل الإيمان، ومن يريدون أن يراهم النّاس ويمدحونهم، ولكنهم لم يسَلّموا حياتهم لشخص الرّب يسوع المسيح. وما أسهل أن يخون مثل هؤلاء الرّب، كما فعل يهوذا الأسخريوطي. يأتي بعض النّاس إلى الكنيسة من أجل راحة الضمير. ويأتي البعض الآخر لأنها أصبحت عادة في حياته. ويأتي فريق آخر من أجل أهداف أرضية لا تمجد الله أبدأ. مثل هؤلاء عميان ولا يعرفون الرّب فعلاً، ولا يعرفون خطته لحياتهم. وعادةً فإن مدَّعي الإيمان والمزيفين ينقادون بشكل سريع للآراء السلبية والهدَّامة، وهم يسيرون في الطرق السهلة التي لا يوجد فيها مقاومة. فهم يذهبون إلى الكنيسة، ويقومون بأعمال العبادة المختلفة من ترانيم وصلوات، ولكنهم في نفس الوقت يعرفون حقيقة أنفسهم بأنهم ممثّلون ومنافقون.

رابعاً: الفضوليون، أي الذين يحركهم حب الاستطلاع. نقرأ في يوحنا 17:12-18: "وَكَانَ الْجَمْعُ الَّذِي مَعَهُ يَشْهَدُ أَنَّهُ دَعَا لِعَازَرَ مِنَ الْقَبْرِ وَأَقَامَهُ مِنَ الأَمْوَاتِ. لِهَذَا أَيْضاً لاَقَاهُ الْجَمْعُ لأَنَّهُمْ سَمِعُوا أَنَّهُ كَانَ قَدْ صَنَعَ هَذِهِ الآيَةً". الذين دخلوا أوروشليم مع الرّب يسوع شهدوا للجموع الّتي كانت في المدينة عن إقامة الرّب يسوع للعازر من الموت. وبين هؤلاء كان جمع من الفضولين. هؤلاء حركهم فضولهم للمجيء من أجل رؤية هذا الإنسان الذي قام بعمل مذهل، أي إقامة لعازر من الموت. مثل هؤلاء النَّاس ليسوا مكرسين للرب يسوع، وليسوا أعداء له أيضاً. فهم سمعوا أشياء مثيرة وملفتة للنظر عن يسوع، وجاؤوا ليروا بأنفسهم حقيقة ما سمعوا عنه. أي أنهم كانوا يبحثون عن اختبار مذهل ومثير،

خامساً: المعارضون والمعاندون والمتآمرون: نقرأ في لوقا 39:19 "وَأَمَّا بَعْضُ الْفَرِّيسِيِّينَ مِنَ الْجَمْع فَقَالُوا لَهُ: يَا مُعَلِّمُ انْتَهِرْ تَلاَمِيذَكَ" وفي يوحنا 42:12 نقرأ ان كثيرين من النَّاس: "لِسَبَبِ الْفَرّيسِيّينَ لَمْ يَعْتَرفُوا بِهِ لِئَلَّا يَصِيرُوا خَارِجَ الْمَجْمَع". المعارضون للرّب يسوع هم الأشخاص الذي يريدون تحقيق مصالحهم الشخصية. هم الذين يرفضون لاهوت وسلطان وملكوت الرّب يسوع، ويريدون أن يجلبوا انتباه النّاس إلى أنفسهم بدلاً من رب المجد يسوع. هم الذين لا يريدون أن يكرسوا أنفسهم للرب يسوع، وذلك لأن التكريس يعني التغيير، ويعني أن التركيز يجب أن ينصب على الرّب يسوع وليس عليهم. المعارضون هم من يريدون أن يدمّروا رسالة الرّب يسوع، وأن يدمّروا ويقضوا على من ينادي برسالة الرّب يسوع. لاحظ قول الإنجيل المقدّس في مرقس 9:11 "وَٱلَّذِينَ تَقَدَّمُوا وَالَّذِينَ تَبِعُوا كَانُوا يَصْرُخُونَ قَائِلِينَ: أُوصَنَّا! مُبَارَكُ الآتِي بِاسْمِ الرَّبِ!".

لم تتغيّر حالة النّاس اليوم. فما أسهل من أن تنقلب المشاعر والعواطف بين ليلة وضحاها. اليوم نصرخ ونهتف ونشجّع شخصاً ما، وغداً ننقلب على ذات الشّخص بروح النّقد والهجوم والعداء. ما أسهل أن نتبع جموع الهاتفين، لأنّ الفرصة وقتها تكون متاحة للهتاف مثل الآخرين. فعندما يكون هنالك احتفال كبير، أو اجتماع حاشد للعبادة والتسبيح، يستطيع كل فرد أن يشارك. ولكن عندما تأتي لحظة الإمتحان الحقيقي، لحظة الطّاعة الشخصيّة للرّب، فما أسهل أن يسقط الفرد ويفشل حتّى في إطاعة أبسط وصايا الرَّب، مثل مسامحة الآخرين أو تشجيعهم أو معاملتهم بمحبّة وتواضع. ننخرط بين الجموع لأنّنا لا نُلاحَظ، ونكون وجهاً في الزّحام. نرنّم في الكنيسة مع الجموع، ولكنّنا نفشل في حياتنا الرّوحية الفردية. ونفشل في بيوتنا حتّى في قراءة آية واحدة من الإنجيل يومياً.

السؤال الذي يتحدانا: من أي المجموعات أنتَ وأنتِ وأنا؟ يعرف الرّب يسوع كل واحد منا حتى ولو كنا بين الجموع المحتشدة. يعرف الرّب يسوع قصتي وقصتك، وخطاياي وخطاياك. يرى الرّب يسوع وجهك، ويرى أيضاً قلبك. يريد الرّب يسوع أن يكون ملكاً على حياتك اليوم، فهل تقبله رباً ومخلصاً لك. هل تصرخ مع الجموع قائلاً: أوصنًا. أوصنًا. أوصنًا.

CELEBRATION OF PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

HOMILY OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS



Joyful acclamations at Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem, followed by his humiliation. Festive cries followed by brutal torture. This twofold mystery accompanies our entrance into Holy Week each year, as reflected in the two characteristic moments of today's celebration: the initial procession with palm branches and the solemn reading of the Passion.

Let us enter into this movement, guided by the Holy Spirit, and thus obtain the grace we sought in our opening prayer: to follow in faith our Saviour's example of humility, to heed his lesson of patient suffering, and thus to merit a share in his victory over the spirit of evil.

Jesus shows us how to face moments of difficulty and the most insidious of temptations by preserving in our hearts a peace that is neither detachment nor superhuman impassivity, but confident abandonment to the Father and to his saving will, which bestows life and mercy. He shows us this kind of abandonment by spurning, at every point in his earthly ministry, the temptation to do things his way and not in complete obedience to the Father. From the experience of his forty days in the desert to the culmination of his Passion, Jesus rejects this temptation by his obedient trust in the Father.

Today, too, by his entrance into Jerusalem, he shows us the way. For in that event, the evil one, the prince of this world, had a card up his sleeve: the card of *triumphalism*. Yet the Lord responded by holding fast to his own way, *the way of humility*.

Triumphalism tries to make it to the goal by shortcuts and false compromises. It wants to jump onto the carriage of the winner. It lives off gestures and words that are not forged in the crucible of the cross; it grows by looking askance at others and constantly judging them inferior, wanting, failures... One subtle form of triumphalism is spiritual worldliness, which represents the greatest danger, the most treacherous temptation threatening the Church (De Lubac). Jesus destroyed triumphalism by his Passion.

The Lord truly rejoiced with the people, with those young people who shouted out his name and acclaimed him as King and Messiah. His heart was gladdened to see the enthusiasm and excitement of the poor of Israel. So much so, that, to those Pharisees who asked him to rebuke his disciples for their scandalous acclamations, he replied: "If these were silent, the very stones would cry out" (*Lk* 19:40). Humility does not mean denying reality: Jesus really is the Messiah, the King.

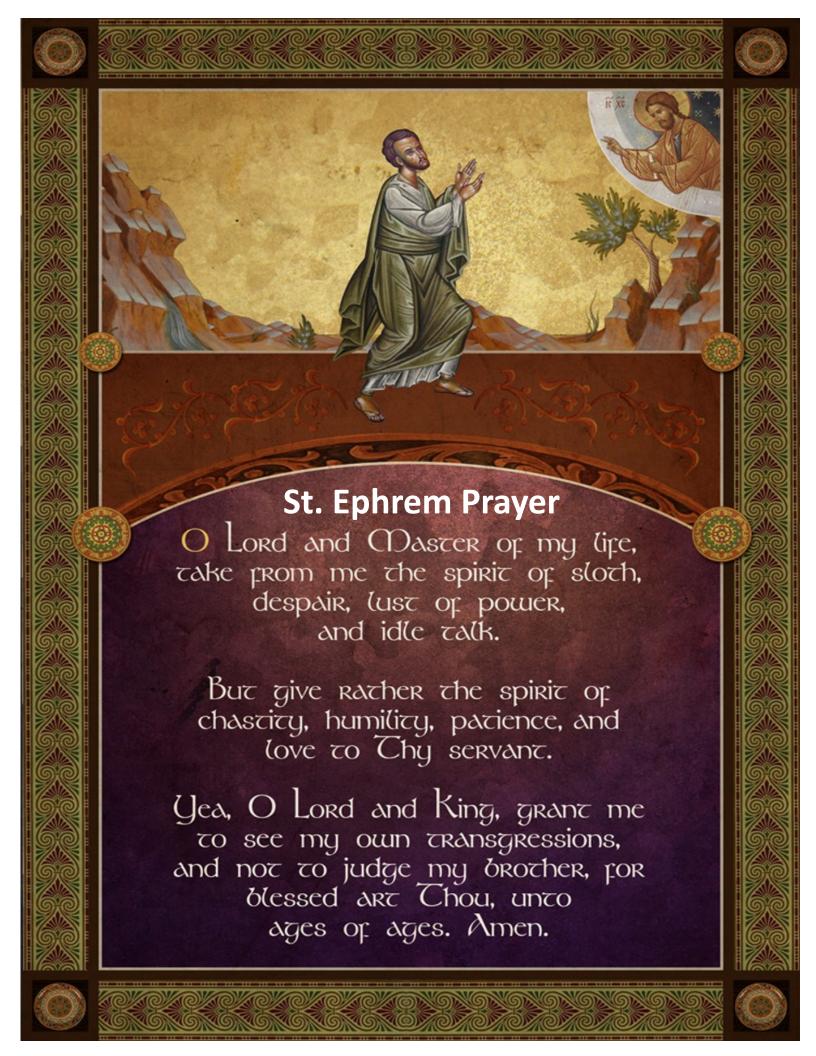
Yet at the same time the heart of Jesus was moving on another track, on the sacred path known to him and the Father alone: the path that leads from "the form of God" to "the form of a servant", the path of self-abasement born of obedience "unto death, even death on a cross" (*Phil* 2:6-8). He knows that true triumph involves making room for God and that the only way to do that is by stripping oneself,

by *self-emptying*. To remain silent, to pray, to accept humiliation. There is no negotiating with the cross: one either embraces it or rejects it. By his self-abasement, Jesus wanted to open up to us *the path of faith* and to precede us on that path.

The first to follow him on that path was his mother, Mary, the first disciple. The Blessed Virgin and the saints had to suffer in walking the path of faith and obedience to God's will. Responding with faith to the harsh and painful events of life entails "a particular heaviness of heart The night of faith. Yet only from that night do we see the dawn of the resurrection break forth. At the foot of the cross, Mary thought once more of the words that the angel had spoken about her Son: "He will be great... The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end" (*Lk* 1:32-33). On Golgotha, Mary faced the complete denial of that promise: her Son was dying on a cross like a criminal. In this way, triumphalism, destroyed by the abasement of Jesus, was likewise destroyed in the heart of his Mother. Both kept silent.

In the footsteps of Mary, countless holy men and women have followed Jesus on the path of humility and obedience. Today, World Youth Day, I would like to mention all those young saints, especially the saints "next door" to us, known only to God; sometimes he likes to surprise us with them. Dear young people, do not be ashamed to show your enthusiasm for Jesus, to shout out that *he is alive* and that he is your life. Yet at the same time, do not be afraid to follow him on the way of the cross. When you hear that he is asking you to renounce yourselves, to let yourselves be stripped of every security, and to entrust yourselves completely to our Father in heaven, then rejoice and exult! You are on the path of the kingdom of God.

Festive acclamations and brutal torture; the silence of Jesus throughout his Passion is profoundly impressive. He also overcomes the temptation to answer back, to act like a "superstar". In moments of darkness and great tribulation, we need to keep silent, to find the courage not to speak, as long as our silence is meek and not full of anger. The meekness of silence will make us appear even weaker, more humble. Then the devil will take courage and come out into the open. We need to resist him in silence, "holding our position", but with the same attitude as Jesus. He knows that the battle is between God and the prince of this world, and that what is important is not putting our hand to the sword but remaining firm in faith. It is God's hour. At the hour that God comes forth to fight, we have to let him take over. Our place of safety will be beneath the mantle of the holy Mother of God. As we wait for the Lord to come and calm the storm (cf. Mt 4:37-41), by our silent witness in prayer we give ourselves and others "an accounting for the hope that is within [us]" (1 Pet 3:15). This will help us to live in the sacred tension between the memory of the promises made, the suffering present in the cross, and the hope of the resurrection.

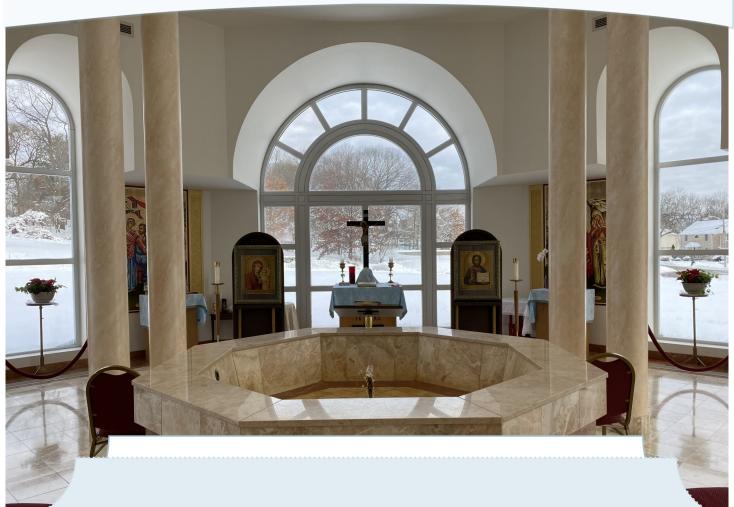

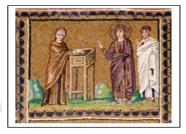

The Widow's Mite

Each year during the Great Fast, the Church encourages us with the example of the "widow's mite". We receive a little box — a "mite box" which we take home. This box symbolizes the offerings (alms) we give during Lent, together with our increased prayers, fasting, and abstinence.

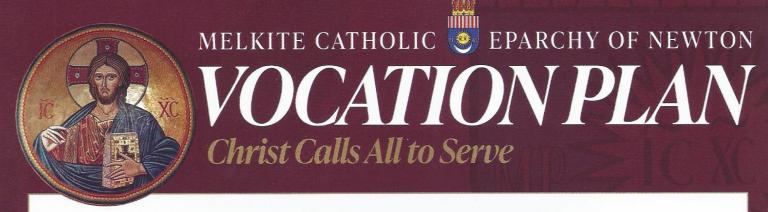
make donations by check directly to the Eparchial Office. Address is on the back. Together our eparchial family can help alleviate the sufferings of God's people.

Bishop François forms New Vocation Team

The goal is to create a "Culture of Service & Vocations" within the Melkite Catholic Church

As Bishop François Beyrouti begins his episcopal ministry, he is emphasizing the Lord's invitation to "serve one another humbly in love" (Gal 5:13). In this spirit, one of his key priorities is to strengthen our focus on vocations throughout the Melkite Catholic Eparchy of Newton.

Thanks be to God, over the past few years, the Melkite Catholic Church in the United States has been blessed with many new vocations to the priesthood and diaconate. Looking toward the future, we can also see that many parishes have aging clergy who have been faithfully serving for so many years. Thus, there is a serious need to ensure uninterrupted pastoral care for our 50 churches and communities and to respond to the needs of our faithful who are asking us to establish new parishes.

Thus Bishop François has convened a new Vocation Team, headed by Fr. John Mefrige and composed of four other priests from each region of the eparchy. The challenge for the team is threefold.

The first task is to re-organize our efforts, both by standardizing the formation of priests and deacons, as well as establishing a clear process for men to discern God's call.

Secondly, Bishop François' vision is that new vocations will flow organically from active ministry in local parishes. Put simply, the men who will one day serve as priests and deacons must now be serving generously in other capacities. A campaign is planned to identify these men—both single and married—and invite them to discern a potential role as reader, subdeacon, deacon, or priest.



Finally, the Vocation Team aims to dramatically improve communications about vocations within the eparchy. For example, the Melkite Catholic community in the United States needs to see the joys of married clergy with families, as well as the blessing of men who serve celibately or enter monastic life. We have a number of digital and print projects planned for 2023 and beyond.

In summary, the Vocation Team is preparing to enter a multi-year process of organizing, inviting, and communicating a "pro-vocations" message throughout the eparchy. The overall vision is to build upon the core message that *Christ calls all to serve*—in all sorts of capacities—to make us a true *ecclesia*, a living Church. Every vocation is vital, including marriage and family, nuns, monks, and the clergy who lead our liturgical worship.

Clergy & Candidate Databases

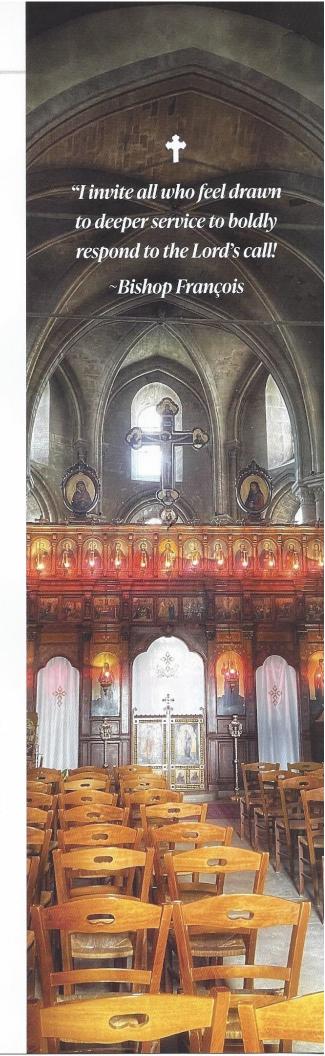
One essential task is to update the biographical information of all our clergy. This will help Bishop François to review the assignments of each deacon and priest and plan for future transitions and retirements. For example, simply knowing the birth dates of all priests allows us to project retirement dates and estimate how many new men we need in formation to serve our growing communities. Similarly, our Vocation Team is streamlining the way we keep track of prospects with a new database of candidates.



2023-2024

Standardizing the Application & Formation Process

We have had a wealth of excellent candidates, but their paths to ordination have been widely varied. Our plan is to standardize the entire process, for both priests and deacons, beginning with a new, more rigorous application process, and continuing with well-defined tracks for both married and celibate seminarians.



Invitation

Becoming Fishers of Men

A call to deeper service is always a call from Christ himself. Experience shows, however, that the call is most often mediated by parish priests. Over the next three years, the role of priests as "inviters" will be a recurring theme in our regular Clergy meetings and annual Clergy Conference. We will also be sending resources to equip priests to be mentors to men in their parishes. The goal is to encourage priests to be true "fishers of men."

Called by Name

Will You Help Identify Future Clergy?

Perhaps the most exciting part of our Vocation Plan is a campaign to identify candidates for readers, subdeacons, deacons, and priests. "Called by Name" will be an eparchy-wide process in which clergy and laity can submit the names of men in our parishes who may

be called to these ministries. Importantly, candidates should be longstanding, faithful members who have demonstrated stability of life and a heart for service. As Jesus told us: "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you" (John 13:14-15).

WINTER 2023-2024

Online Discernment Meetings

Men who are submitted in the Called by Name campaign will be invited to begin the discernment process through a series of online meetings with Bishop François and the Vocation Team. The purpose is to open dialogue and offer guidance for listening to God's call.

SPRING 2024

Discernment Retreat

Those who have faithfully participated in the online meetings will be invited to an in-person Discernment Retreat. This is an opportunity for talks, personal prayer, and Liturgical Prayer. The goal is that after the retreat, we will have a good sense of the next cohort of men who will advance into formation, either toward diaconate or priesthood.

In the coming months, keep your eyes open for our Vocations Bulletin! It will be similar in format to this Vocation Plan and will include articles and photos highlighting our new seminarians, readers, subdeacons, deacons, priests, monks, and nuns. We will also focus on their families who nourish them and also highlight couples who are in ministry together The overall goal is to show that living out one's baptism is the path to holiness—and that responding to God's call begins with faithful service and an open heart.

APRIL AND NOVEMBER, 2023-2024

Bi-annual Vocation Days

Twice a year, in Spring and Fall, the Vocations Team will prepare resources for parishes to place special emphasis on vocations, by preaching as well as in children's catechesis and youth ministry. This will align with the readings and Feast days in our Melkite Catholic liturgical calendar.

New Online Presence for Vocations

We will include robust vocation pages on the Melkite Catholic Eparchy of Newton's website, Melkite.org. This will refresh our online presence, and provide a platform for our Called by Name program and other Vocation resources.

Other Communication Efforts

In Year Two of our Vocation Plan, we would like to re-energize our social media presence, specifically with a series of videos on priests, deacons, and seminarians. We will also work on an e-newsletter with tips and encouragement for young people to live out their baptism and discern their vocations

The Vocation Plan is not just the work of the Vocation Team. It requires the enthusiastic support of clergy, educators, and those who work with youth. Above all, it requires families who make their home a true domestic church. All are encouraged to find some role to play. 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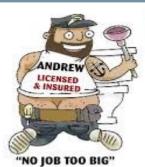
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
