PROKIMENON (Tone 7)

The Lord will give strength to his people; the Lord will bless his people with peace.

READING from the Second Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians

BRETHREN, yes, working together with him, we beg you not to receive God's grace in vain. For he says, In an acceptable time I have heard you, and in the day of salvation, I have helped you. (Is.49:8) Look, now is the acceptable time; look, now is the day of salvation! We give no offense to anyone, that our ministry may not be blamed. On the contrary, let us behave in all circumstances as God's ministers, in much patience, in tribulations, in hardships, in distress; in stripes, in imprisonments, in riots; in labors, in sleepless nights, in fastings; in innocence, in knowledge, in long-suffering, in kindness, in the Holy Spirit, in unaffected love; in the word of truth, in God's power; with the armor of justification on the right hand and on the left; in honor and dishonor, in evil report and good report; as deceivers and yet truthful, as unknown and yet well known, as dying, and look, we live; as punished, but not killed, as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing, as poor, yet enriching many, as having nothing, yet possessing all things.

EMBRACING THE CROSS IN YOUR LIFE

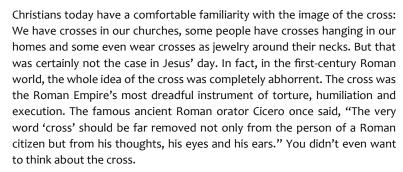
Imagine Jesus looking you in the eye and saying the following words:

"If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (Lk 9:23).

"Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me, cannot be my disciple" (Lk 14:27).

Those are the stark words Jesus spoke to the original disciples.

And it floored them. Pick up your cross?



That's what makes Jesus' statement so startling. For Jesus to tell his disciples to pick up a cross and follow him would have been as shocking as him telling people in the modern world to pick up their electric chairs or pick up their guillotines and follow him. Of all the images Jesus could have used to depict discipleship, why would he choose this most horrific one? Noah got a rainbow. Moses got a burning bush. The Magi got a star in the sky. Why do Jesus' disciples get a cross?

Because, as we will see, it's only through the cross that we find our ultimate fulfillment in life and experience what we're made for: the total, perfect, self-giving love of God himself.

When you are on mission for the Gospel, you should expect trials, roadblocks, obstacles, rejection. Don't be surprised when mission requires a lot of your time and energy, when people misunderstand you, when people turn down your invitations or turn away from the Gospel. All this happened to Jesus, so you shouldn't expect anything less. After all, Jesus promised the cross, not comfort. But why?

It all has to do with his love. For Jesus, the cross is much more than a form of execution. It's ultimately his fullest revelation of God's inner life, which is all about total self-giving love: "God is love" (1 Jn 4:8). For all eternity, the Father loves the Son and gives himself totally to the Son. The Son in return loves the Father, giving of himself completely to the Father, holding nothing back. And this bond of love between the Father and the Son is the Third Person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit. God's inner life as the Trinity is all about perfect, infinite, self-giving love.



But what happens when the Eternal Son of God enters time and space and takes on human flesh in Jesus Christ? He continues doing what he has done for all eternity: giving himself in love totally to the Father. But in Christ, the Son's infinite divine love is now expressed in finite human nature. That's like putting a rubber balloon up to a water hydrant: the balloon is going to explode. When

infinite love expresses itself in our limited, finite humanity, it will involve suffering, sacrifice, death: "Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (Jn 15:13).

There are many ways we can express our love through little acts of self-denial. The more we pick up our cross daily and follow Jesus, the more we will become like him and love like him. This is how we know that we are truly living as disciples (being "in earnest," as Cardinal Newman calls it): We are willing to embrace the cross.

As you seek to take on a new disposition toward self-denial and learn to embrace the crosses in your own life, the first step is to do some reflection. Set aside some time for prayer in which you examine the crosses in your life and reflect on how Jesus might be asking you to respond to them. Consider the following questions:

- •In what ways is your spiritual life or your mission still focused on self, rather than on surrendering to Christ?
- •Is your mission driven by love or by what you get out of it?
- •Do you maintain relationships with those who are different from you or who may misunderstand your faith? Or do you choose to associate with those who are similar to you?
- •When you encounter challenges in mission (people don't come to Bible study, people say no to the Gospel or to an invitation), do you get discouraged or tempted to give up? Or do you persevere and offer up the trials for love of souls?
- •Do you attempt to hide from persecution or rejection, or do you continue to pursue others with a heart of love?
- •Do you pray more for the various situations you want Jesus to change, or do you bring the darkened areas of your own heart to Jesus and allow him to transform them as he desires?

After your reflection, choose one way you can embrace these crosses and set a goal for how you will do that every day.

الالتزام الأول: إنكار الذات:

ولماذا إنكار الذات، أي إزاحتها من المشهد؟ ذلك،

حتى يكون المسيح الكل في الكل، الأول والآخِر، محبوباً مُطاعاً أكثر من النفس وأكثر من النفس وأكثر من الأهل والعالم كله. ففي حضور الذات ومن ينتسب إليها لا يوجد مكان لله. وفي إرضاء الذات وإكرامها والإصغاء لمطالبها والركض بها إلى فيض الخلاعة والفساد، وتخليصها من شركة الألم وعبور الباب الضيق، ضياعها وهلاكها؛ بينما من يرفض شهواتها ويُحطِّم كبرياءها وينفي عنها اكتفاءها وانكفاءها على ما لها ولامبالاتها بالأخر، هو في الحقيقة يحفظها من الضياع ويستبقيها إلى الأبد.

وفي الحياة المسيحية العملية، فإن التوبة والقداسة والخدمة وطاعة الوصية تبدأ وتستمر وتنمو بإنكار الذات. وحضور الذات وتألقها، إما أن يُعطِّل كل اتجاه نحو الله، وإما أن يزيّف الحياة كلها. فتبقى الذات نشطة، ولكن تتنكَّر تحت عباءة رقيقة من التظاهُر بالعبادة الإرضاء الناس، أو تنسب لها كل العمل الروحي لا للنعمة. ونتيجة هذا البر الذاتي دائماً صفر. فهو جهاد فاشل لا طائل من ورائه دون اكتشاف مصدر التغيير والقوة وهو الروح القدس.

الالتزام الثاني: حَمْل الصليب:

هذا الالتزام يرتبط ارتباطاً وثيقاً بالالتزام السابق: فمَن يحب نفسه لن يقبل حَمْل الصليب أو يحتمله، ولن يقتنع بضرورته وسيجتهد أن يتفاداه بكل وسيلة.

- والمعنى المباشر لحمل الصليب هو قبول الألم والعار والاضطهاد والظلم بأنواعه من أجل المسيح والكنيسة حتى إلى بذل الحياة ككل شهيد. وكان المحكوم عليه بالصَّلْب يحمل صليبه إلى مكان تنفيذ العقوبة، وهو ما جازه الرب نفسه: "فخرج وهو حاملً صليبه "يو 19: 17). والمؤمن وهو يحمل صليبه يُشارك الرب الذي تألم مظلوماً ولم يفتح فاه (إش 53: 7)، "وأكمِّل نقائص شدائد المسيح في جسمي لأجل جسده، الذي هو الكنيسة" (كو 1: 24)، "لأعرفه وقوة قيامته وشركة آلامه مُتشبِّهاً بموته لعلِّي أبلغ إلى قيامة الأموات" (في 3: 10و11). فالذين يتفادون الإضطهاد من أجل المسيح ويهربون منه طالبين اللجوء إلى حيث الراحة، ينكرون الإيمان وينسحبون من تبعيتهم للمسيح مهما قالت أوراقهم غير ذلك.

- والقديس بطرس هو أيضاً عاش مُقاتلاً شجاعاً لم تهزمه أسوار السجن ولا جلدات الحلاَّدين، وقاد الكنيسة الوليدة في أورشليم واليهودية والسامرة، وبشَّر الأمم أيضاً، وكتب للمؤمنين مُشجِّعاً على احتمال الآلام تمثَّلاً بالرب (1بط 2: 19و21)، وانتظاراً لمجيئه لتمجيد قديسيه، وحَمَل الصليب حتى روما حيث سلَّم أنفاسه الأخيرة مصلوباً منكَّس الرأس. فهو نقَد الوصية بقبول الألم والجهاد ضد الخطية وضد محبة العالم الحاضر حتى الموت.

- وحَمْل الصليب يعني أيضاً التخلِّي عن رفاهية الحياة ومحبة المال وتعظُّم المعيشة، وبَدَلَ المغالاة في التمتَّم يكون السعي لسدِّ حاجة المعوزين اقتساماً للخيرات، ومشاركة المرضى(1) ومنكوبي اضطرابات الطبيعة والمجاعات وغيرها، بالخدمة والتبرُّع السخي برهاناً لصِدْق الإيمان. لقد صار الصليب بالفعل رمزاً لشركة الألم مع المسيح ومع الأخرين(2).

- كما يعني حَمْل الصليب أيضاً احتمال المرض الطويل وألم الجسد وضعفه والتجارب الثقيلة كشركة مع المسيح في آلامه بشكر وصبر دون تنمُّر أو دمدمة وكتدبير إلهي يقصد نمو الإيمان والتوبة وضمور الميول الجسدية: "فإن مَن تألَّم في الجسد كُفَّ عن الخطية" (1بط 4: 1). وأيوب الصدِيق في محنته الهائلة وصبره واحتماله يُقدِّم نموذجاً من العهد القديم لحمل الصليب بتسليم كامل لمشيئة الله، حتى صار مثالاً في العهد الجديد: "ها نحن نُطوِّب الصابرين. قد سمعتم بصبر أيوب، ورأيتم عاقبة الرب" (يع 5:



11). والرسول بولس تضرَّع كثيراً من أجل "شوكة في الجسد"، ولكن طُلِبَ إليه أن يتملها، وسمع رسالة لكل مَن يجتازون مثل ضيقته: "تكفيك نعمتي لأن قوتي في الضعف تُكْمَل." (2كو 12: 9)

ويتصل بالمعنى السابق أيضاً احتمال رفيق الحياة أو القريب (شيخاً أو شاباً أو فاقد العقل أو المنحرف. وبعض هذه الألام أقسى احتمالاً مما لو كانت في الإنسان نفسه. والتعايش معها خاصة لو امتدت طويلاً محنة قد يهون معها الموت. ولكن استحضار شركة الصليب مع

المسيح هنا تملأ النفس بروح الطاعة والتسليم "لِمَن يقضي بعدلً" (1بط 2: 23)، والثقة في أن هذه الألام ليست منسية قدَّام الله، وسيأتي اليوم الذي يُكافًأ فيه مَن صبروا إلى المنتهى (مت 24: 13).

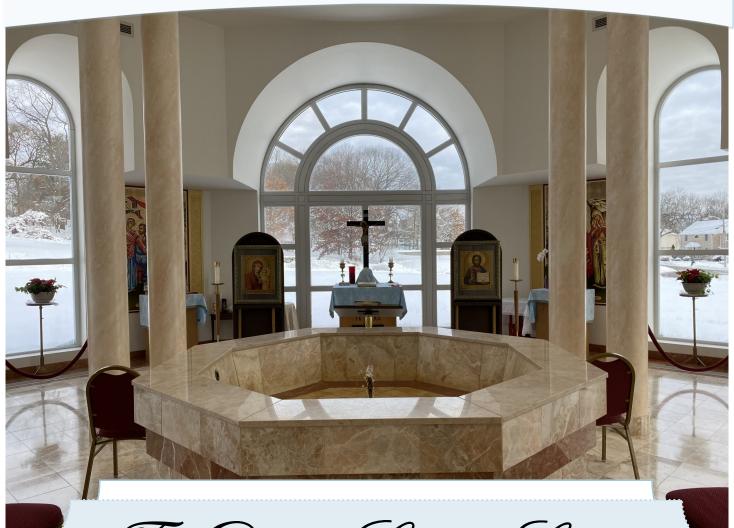
- وبالنسبة للخادم في خدمته، فإنَّ حَمَّل الصليب هو بذل نفسه من أجل مخدوميه صلاةً وجَهداً ووقتاً واحتمالاً وصبراً وافتقاراً وملاحقةً للشاردين والمقاومين لإعادتهم إلى الحظيرة، والاهتمام بالبعيد والقريب، والغريب والضيف، والاتضاع حتى إلى غسل الأقدام طاعةً لوصية السرد.

الالتزام الثالث: يترك كل ما له:

نحن لا نستطيع أن نتبع إلهنا ونحن نحمل معنا أثقالنا: محبتنا لذواتنا ولميول جسدنا وللعالم والمال والأشياء. وكان تَرْك التلاميذ الأوائل للسفينة الممتلئة بالسمك الكثير وللأهل ليتبعوا يسوع (مت 4: 20و22، مر 1: 18و20، لو 5: 11)، وتَرْك لاوي لمكان الجباية (مت 9: 9، مر 2: 14، لو 5: 28)، وتَرْك السامرية لجرَّتها (يو 4: 28)؛ رمزاً للتخلِّي عن الماضي الشرير (أو المضاد للإيمان) أي للتوبة وتحوُّل توجُّه الحياة نحو المسيح. فتغيير الحياة شرط واضح لنصير ضمن خاصة الرب أي تلاميذه. والشاب الغني، الذي استكثر أن يتخلِّي عن أمواله ويُوزِّ عها على الفقراء(3)، أخفق أن يتبع الرب (حاملاً الصليب)، رغم نيته الطيبة، لأنه أحب أمواله أكثر (مت 19: 16- 22، مر 10: 17-22، لو 18: 18-23). والقديس بولس، عندما تبع يسوع، حَسِبَ موقعه المرموق في الجماعة اليهودية وكل التزامه الناموسي واضطهاده للكنيسة، وهو ما كان له ربحاً وكرامة؛ خسارة ونفاية من أجل فضل معرفة الرب وبرّه وربحه (في 18-8).

والذين يريدون "خدمة السيِّدين" باعتبارها الحل الوسط المريح الذي يتيح لهم إرضاء ذُواتهم وتخدير ضمائرهم بالتديُّن الشكلي، هي مرفوضة من قِبَل الرب لانها حل محكوم عليه بالفشل (مت 6: 24)، وطريق لا يؤدِّي إلاَّ إلى الضياع. فامرأة ِ لوط خرجت من سدوم مع عائلتها، ولكن سدوم ظلت في قلبها، وكانت النتيجة وبالا عليها (تك 19: 26). وبنو إسرائيل، الذين خرجوا من أرض مصر بذراع رفيعة، ظل اشتياقهم لا إلى أرض الموعد، وإنما إلى أرض العبودية، فبادوا جميعاً في البرية ولم يدخل منهم كنعان عندما تكلُّم الرب عن صعوبة دخول المتَّكلين على أموالهم إلى ملكوت الله، وأنَّ أيسر منه مرور جمل من ثقب إبرة، بُهِتَ التلاميذ جداً قائلين: "إذاً مَن يستطيع أن يخلص"، فقال لهم يسوع: "هذا عند الناس غير مستطاع، ولكن عند الله كل شيء مستطاع" (مت 19: 23-26، مر 10: 23-27، لو 18: 24-27). فالمسيح مسئول عمَّن يتبعه، وهو الذي بنعمته يسند إيمانه وجهاده واحتماله وصبره وتوبته وعبادته وخدمته. وبحسب كلماته فنحن بدونه لا نقدر أن نفعل شيئاً (يو 15: 5). ومعلِّمنا بولس يهتف: "أستطيع كل شيء في المسيح الذي يُقوِيني" (في 4: 13). والقديس بطرس يحتُّنا أن نلقي رجاءناً بالتمام على النعمة (أبط 1: 13). والذين يُنادون باستحالة حياة القداسة وتبعية الله هم صادقون إذا كان الاعتماد في ذلك على الإرادة وحدها وضبط النفس الذاتي، فهذا بالفعل طريق مسدود نهايته الفشل واليأس؛ ولكن المسيح الذي دعانا لنتبعه، هو الذي يمسك بأيدينا ويقودنا في موكب نصرته، وهو إذ كان يقُول: "احملوا نيري عليكم" (متُ 11: 29) ويصفه أنه هين، فذلك لأنه حالما نقبل بالنية حمل نيره يأتي هو ليحمل العبء كله عنا.

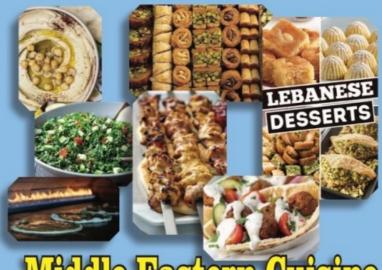
