Epistle: Sunday of the Forefathers, Colossians 3: 4-11 PROKIMENON

Blessed are You, O Lord, God of our fathers, and Your name is worthy praise and glorious forever.

Stichon: For You are just in all You have done to us, and all Your works are true and Your ways right.

Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Colossians

Brethren, when Christ, our life, appears, then you too shall appear in glory. Put to death whatever in your members is of the earth: immorality, uncleanness, lust, evil desire, covetousness, which is a form of idol-worship. Because of these passions, God's wrath comes upon the sons of disobedience and you yourselves once walked in them when they were your (way of) life. But now, you too put them all away; anger, wrath, malice, abusive language and foul-mouthed utterances. Do not lie to one another. Strip off the old man with his deeds and put on the new, one that is being renewed toward perfect knowledge according to his creator's image (Cf. Gn. 1:26). Here there is no Gentile and Jew, no circumcised and uncircumcised, no Barbarian and Scythian, no slave and freeman, but Christ is all things, and in all.

Alleluia (Tone 4)

Moses and Aaron were among His priests, and Samuel among those who called upon His name.

Stichon: The just cried out, and the Lord heard them, and He delivered them from all their trials.

Gospel: Sunday of Forefathers (11th of Holy Cross) Luke 14: 16-24 (The Great Feast)

The Lord told this parable, "A certain man gave a great supper, and he invited many. And he sent his servant at supper time to tell those invited to come, for everything is now ready. And they all with one accord began to excuse themselves. The first said to him, 'I have bought a farm, and I must go out and see it; I pray you hold me excused.' And another said, 'I have bought five yokes of oxen, and I am on my way to try them; I pray you hold me excused.' And another said, 'I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.' And the servant returned, and reported these things to his master. Then the master of the house became angry and said to his servant. 'Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in here the poor, and the crippled, and the lame, and the blind.' And the servant said, 'Sir, your order has been carried out, and still there is room.' Then the master said to the servant, 'Go out into the highways and hedges, and make them come in, so that my house may be filled. For I tell you that none of those who were invited shall taste of my supper.' For many are called but few are chosen."



Following Jesus Kids bulletin





The king sent his servants to call all the people in the street to his son's wedding. Follow the road on the map from the castle's courtyard all the way to the farmland. The people in the houses next to the road you pass are invited to the wedding.

You can colour in the houses if you like. Who was invited to the feast?

Excuses.. Excuses



As I meditate on the Parable of the Great Banquet I am impressed with a number of themes:

1. Rejection and Insult

We feel badly when we are rejected, but what about the Father? Think of his grief and broken heart. Think of his anger and mercy. I recall the verses at the beginning of John's Gospel that express this:

"He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him.

Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God --children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God." (John 1:11-13)

Jesus told us,

"If the world hates you, keep in mind that it hated me first. If you belonged to the world, it would love you as its own. As it is, you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world. That is why the world hates you. Remember the words I spoke to you: 'No servant is greater than his master.' If they persecuted me, they will persecute you also. If they obeyed my teaching, they will obey yours also. They will treat you this way because of my name, for they do not know the One who sent me." (John 15:18-21)

This parable is a bittersweet reminder of rejection, but also of mercy.

2. Mercy and grace

The second theme I see is one of grace and mercy. Those who are not worthy to come to the host's table -- the poor, lame, crippled, blind -- are now invited. That is you and that is me. We are unworthy to eat at our Host's table, but we have been invited and cleansed. How true it is: "Blessed is the man who will eat at the feast in the kingdom of God" (14:15b).

As I read the servant's invitation, "Come, for everything is now ready," my mind begins singing the gospel hymn by Charlotte G. Homer and W.A. Ogden:

"All things are ready," come to the feast! Come, for the table now is spread:

Ye famishing, ye weary, come and thou shalt be richly fed.

Hear the invitation, come, 'whosoever will.'

Praise God for full salvation for 'whosoever will.'

This is God's mercy, pure and simple.

3. Evangelism

A third, and closely related theme is evangelism. The poor, lame, crippled, and blind are now sought out. They are not just invited, but they are sought out and urged, compelled, to accept the invitation. The poor and oppressed among the Jewish people are in view, but also the Gentiles. We are the servants, and bring a marvelous message of invitation and acceptance and forgiveness. We must take our role seriously and urge the invitation wherever we are. This is not a take-it-or-leave-it task. It is a mission, the mission of the Host, and we must fulfill it.

4. Judgment

But those who reject the invitation -- for whatever reason -- will not taste of the Master's banquet. We bear good news, but with humility and sadness, realizing that contained within the very message are the seeds of judgment. However, it's not like we are damning people by telling them the Good News. Actually, the Good News is their only hope -- they are already under God's judgment for their sins. It's only that deliberately rejecting the invitation invites greater judgment, and that saddens us.

5. Lame Excuses

I am sorry to say that, in the lame excuses of the original guests, I hear some of my own shallow excuses for not doing God's will. We may be able to convince ourselves that what we are doing is noble, but I am afraid that way too often our excuses are an insult to God. He is the Host and he is the Master of the house. It is God's mercy that we are not consumed!

6. God's Plan

The final theme that I see here is one of God's plan. The host has prepared food for a large number of guests, and he won't be satisfied until his house is completely full.

"The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance." (2 Peter 3:9)

I get the feeling -- though this is not inherent in the parable before us -- that as soon as the last place is taken at the banquet, the door will be shut and the feast will begin. The Father is lingering, waiting for each and every seat to be taken, and the End will not come until that has occurred. We catch a hint of this in Second Peter:

"Since everything will be destroyed in this way, what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives as you look forward to the day of God and *speed its coming.*" (2 Peter 3:11-12)

I believe we can "speed" the coming of the Day of the Lord by evangelism. "And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come" (Matthew 24:14).

As we do throughout the Bible. we see the themes of free will and predestination intertwined -- God's established purpose, our obedience to serve him, and the acceptance of the invitation by those we speak to. How it all fits together God only knows.

This parable is shocking socially. It is also sobering and urgent. May God use it to urge you to thankfulness and obedience, too.

Prayer

Father, in this parable I sense your hurt and your urgency. Please help me to share your heart. Your sorrow, you love for the poor, and the urgency of your invitation. Shake complacency out of me. Help me to be a worthy and obedient bearer of your invitation. In Jesus' name, I pray. Amen.

الوليمة السماوية



هذا الأحد هو الأحد الحادي عشر من لوقا ويُعرف أيضاً "بأحد الأجداد " وهو يأتي قبل ميلاد ربنا ومخلصنا يسوع المسيح بالجسد وفيه نقيم تذكار جميع الآباء الأبرار من العهد القديم، من ابر اهيم مروراً بجميع الأبرار وأنبياء العهد القديم الذين حضروا وتنبأوا بمجيء المسيح (المسيّا) المخلّص.

القراءة الإنجيلية من لوقا الإصحاح (14: 16- 24) وهي عن مثّل يُعرف ب"مثل المدعوين إلى العشاء" أو مثل"العشاء العظيم" وهذا المثل قاله يسوع بينما كان مدعواً إلى " بيت أحد رؤساء الفريسيين في السبت ليأكل خبزاً " (14: 1) وكان الفريسيون " يُر اقبونه ". لقد ألقى يسوع هذا المثل في بيت الفريسي بعد أن حذرهم من "الجلوس في أول المتكات" ثم أعطاهم تعليماً عن الحب والعطاء قائلاً لهم: " إذا صنعت غذاء أو عشاء فلا تذع أصدقائك ولا إخوتك لئلا يدعوك هم أيضاً فتكون لك مكافأة، بل ادع المساكين والجدع والعرج والعربان" (14: 13).

يأتي هذا المثل رداً على قول أحد المتكئين: "طوبى لمن يأكل خبزاً في ملكوت الله". في تعليقه على هذا القول يقول القديس غريغوريوس اللاهوتي: "يبدو أن هذا الرجل كان جسدياً ومُستمعاً غير مبالي للأمور التي سلمها المسيح، ولم يتمكن من فهم ما تكلم به المسيح بشكل صحيح، لقد ظنّ أن المكافأة للقديسين هي مكافأة جسدية وليست روحية".

يبدأ المثل بقول الربّ: " إنسانٌ صنع عشاءً عظيماً ودعى كثيرين فأرسل عبده في ساعة العشاء يقول للمدعوين". يرى بعض الآباء القديسون (كيرللس الإسكندري) في هذا الإنسان صورة عن الله " الآب " الذي أرسل ابنه الوحيد، الربّ يسوع المسيح، والذي بحسب الرسول بولس " أخلى نفسه آخذاً صورة عبد صائراً في شبه الناس" (فيلبي 12: 7). تبدوالصورة أوضح في هذا المثل بحسب الإنجيلي متى (28: 1- 14) إذ يجعل من هذا الإنسان " مَلِكاً صنع عُرساً لإبنه " (متى 28: 1). لقد أرسل الله ابنه الوحيد ليدعو شعبه إلى الخلاص.

هذا الإنسان النبيل قد جهّز العشاء وأرسل عبده ليقول المدعوين: " تعالوا فإن كل شيء قد أعّد " كل شيء جاهز و لا ينقص إلا حضوركم. قد يتوقع الإنسان أنه من الصعب رفض مثل هكذا دعوة ولكن الأمر الغريب أن المدعوين " طفق كلهم واحداً فواحد يستعفون ". لقد اعتذر الجميع عن الحضور متعللين بأسباب وحجج مختلفة، لكنها من حيث جوهرها هي واحدة، يقول القديس باسيليوس الكبير: " لم يستطيعوا المجيء وذلك لأن الذهن البشري عندما يكون منشغلاً بالإهتمامات العالمية يُصبح ضعيفاً في الإهتمام في الأمور التي شه".

لقد اختصر الربّ يسوع هذه الإهتمامات البشرية بما يلي: الأول، اشترى حقلاً، والثاني لديه خمسة أزواج بقر يُريد أن يجرّبها، أما الأخير فيقول أنه تزوج من امرأة وهو لا يستطيع أن يأتي. هذه النماذج الثلاثة تُلجِّص في جوهرها كافة الأعذار والإهتمامات النشرية.

يُفسر القديس غريغوريوس اللاهوتي هذه الإهتمامات بالنحو التالي: أولاً،الذي اشترى الحقل هو الإنسان الذي لديه هوى الإقتناء، لقد كان الفريسيون والكتبة متعلقين بحقولهم، أي ممتلكاتهم الدنيوية، لم يكن لديهم لا الوقت ولا الرغبة في التفكير في نفوسهم وخلاصها.

أما الثاني الذي اشترى خمسة أزواج من البقر، فهي تُشير إلى حواس الإنسان الخمسة والتي بحق يجب أن تُسمى "بالنير كونها مزدوجة في كلا الجنسين". (العظة 35 من لوقا). هذه الحواس هي عطية مهمة من لله وهي تعطينا إمكانية أن نتواصل مع العالم الخارجي ولكن هذه الحواس عندما تخضع للشهوة تحيد عن هدفها الطبيعي وتُصبح خادمة للشرير.

أما الثالث الذي قد تزوج، فمن الواضح أن الهدف ليس إهانة الزواج والذي هو سرّ مُقدّس ولكن ماذا الذي يجب أن يفهم من الزوجة هنا "هو إشباع الشهوات الجسدية" (غريغوريوس اللاهوتي).

يكتب القديس يوحنا الإنجيلي في رسالته الأولى: " لا تُحبّوا العالم ولا الأشياء التي في العالم، لأن كل ما في العالم شهوة الجسد وشهوة العين وتعظّم المعيشة ليس من الأب بل

من العالم". يمكن أن نرى هنا الرابط بين اهتمامات المدعوين وهذه الأنواع الثلاث من الشهوات التي يذكرها الإنجيلي يوحنا. فالأول يمثل شهوة تعظم المعيشة، أي حبّ اقتناء الممتلكات الدنيوية أما الثاني فيمثل شهوة العين، عندما تنحرف الحواس عن هدفها الأصلي والثالث يمثل شهوة الجسد وإشباع رغباتها.

عندما رفض المدعوون هذه الدعوة، أرسل السيّد عبده قائلاً: " اخرج سريعاً إلى شوارع المدينة وأزقيها وأدخل المساكين والجدع والعميان والعرج إلى ههنا". لقد سبق الربّ يسوع وأعلن المتكاين معه قائلاً: إذا صنعت ضيافة فأدع المساكين والجدع والعميان". " لقد اختار الشجهال العالم ليخزي الحكماء واختار الضعفاء ليخزي الأقوياء" (1 كور 1: 27- 28). لقد رفض المدعوون من نخبة الشعب ومن الفريسيين، والكتبة العارفين بالكتب المقدسة ورؤساء الكهنة دعوة الربّ يسوع فأصبحت الدعو موجهة إلى العشارين والزناة والخطأة، "إذ أن العشارين والزواني يسبقونكم إلى ملكوت الله " (متى 21: 31) وأيضاً " كثيرون أولون يكونون آخرين وآخرون أولين "(متى 19- 30) وبرغم ذلك عاد العبد ليقول لسيّده: " قد قضي ما أمرت به ويبقى أيضاً محل ". فقال السيّد للعبد: "اخرج إلى الطرق والأسيجة واضطر هم للدخول حتى يمتلىء البيت".

لقد سكب الله رحمته أيضاً على الوثنيين وهذا ما يشير إليه " الذين في الطرق والأسيجة " الطريق يشير هنا إلى طريق حياة الأمم الوثنية الذي ضلوا عن طريق التعليم القويم وقادهم ذلك إلى تعاليم خاطئة. أما الأسيجة فتشير هنا إلى حياة الخطيئة التي كانوا يعيشونها لأن الخطيئة بمثابة السياج أوالحائط الذي يفصلنا عن الله" (القديس باسيليوس الكبير).

يقول السيّد للعبد: "اضطرهم إلى الدخول حتى يمتلىء بيتي" بالطبع لا يحمل الطلب هنا معنى الإجبار بالإكراه، ولكنه يحمل معنى الإصرار والعزم الثابت للسيّد بإكمال الدعوة إلى العشاء وإن رفض المدعوين الدعوة فإن هذا لا يثني عزيمة السيّد من أن يُرسل دعوته إلى آخرين، لمن هم من الخارج. يقول السيّد في سفر الرؤيا: "هانذا واقف على الباب وأقرع، إن سمع أحد وفتح الباب أدخل إليه وأتعشى معه وهو معي (رؤيا 3: 20).

إن الربّ الإله منذ العهد القديم ومروراً بالعهد الجديد إلى يومنا هذا يستخدم طُرُقاً مختلفة ووسائل متعددة من أجل دعوة البشرية إلى الخلاص لأنه " يُريد الجميع أن يخلصوا وإلى معرفة الحق أن يُقلوا" (تيموثاوس 2: 4).

إن الآية الأخيرة في إنجيل اليوم " ولأن المدعوين كثيرون والمختارين قليلون" هي آية مُضافة إلى المقطع الإنجيلي وهي مأخوذة من(متى 12: 14) وقد أضيفت إلى المقطع الإنجيلي حتى يكتمل معنى النص.

لقد رأت الكنيسة المقدسة في مَثَل هذا العشاء صورة عن الوليمة السماوية المذكورة في سفر الرؤيا، إذ يقول الملاك للإنجيلي يوحنا: " اكتب طوبى المدعوين إلى عشاء عرس الخروف" (رؤ 9: 9) هذه الدعوة السماوية ليست إلا سرّ الأفخارستيا المقدسة، المشاركة في جسد الربّ الطاهر ودمه الكريمين.

هذه الدعوة إلى "وليمة الإيمان" نجد لها صدىً في عظة القديس يوحنا الذهبي الفم في الفصح المقدس، يكتب: " ادخلوا إذا جميعكم إلى فرح ربكم، أيها الأولون والأخيرون. أكر موا هذا النهار، المائدة ملائة فتنعموا جميعكم. العجل سمين فلا يخرج أحد جائعاً. تمتعوا جميعكم بوليمة الإيمان"

لقد أرسل الله ابنه الوحيد، كلمة الله المتجبّدة، الذي بذل حياته على الصليب من أجل خلاص العالم فكان هو " المُقرّب والمُقرّب، القابل والمُقرّر ع "، والذي أعطانا جسده الطاهر ودمه الكريمين المهراق من أجل حياة العالم، فاليوم " إن سمعتم صوته فلا تقسّوا قلوبكم" (عبرانيين 3: 15) بل فلنبادرإلى الذي دعانا إلى هذه الوليمة السماوية حتى نصير مشاركين الحياة الأبدية والملكوت. آمين.

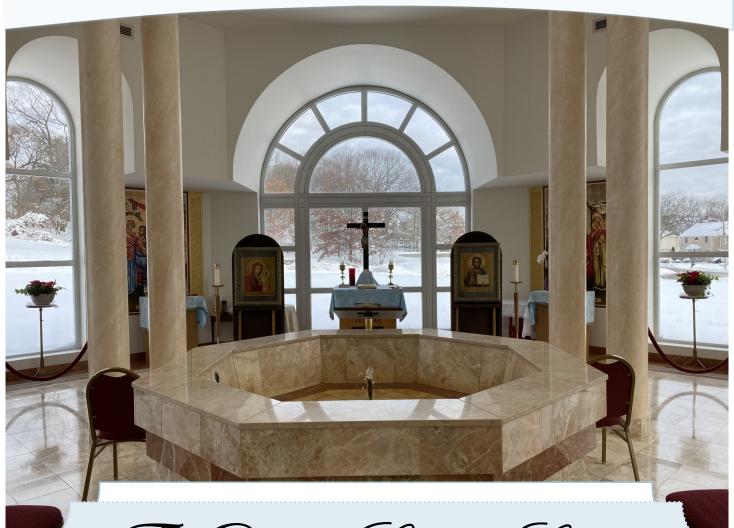

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

HVAC & Boiler Replacement: Proposals received, estimated cost \$196,000. Boiler does need immediate replacing, awaiting timeframe. HVAC system is okay for now



Flooring Upgrades: Proposal received, estimated cost \$50,000 (carpeting for Church, Cultural Center, office & hallway), awaiting samples and timeframe.
